

What is tai chi?

In this class, students will learn the Yang style, long form of Tai Chi Chuan, a series of 108 graceful and flowing movements which are both challenging and rewarding. Each posture flows into the next without pause, ensuring that your body is in constant motion. Through this system of gentle physical exercise and stretching, you will eventually begin to practice total concentration on moving energy through the body. This practice develops and requires deep strength and relaxation.

Tai chi is actually a type of chi gung, an exercise focused on moving chi (life force) through channels in the body, known as meridians. Tai chi and chi gung are an integral part of Chinese medicine. These exercises are often prescribed in the treatment of illnesses, and used as preventive medicine.
