THE HISTORY OF GUALALA ARTS

Gualala Arts was founded in 1961 by volunteers who envisioned a community center for the arts, and undertook the tasks of planning, fundraising, and pulling together to make that dream a reality. It took 18 years to raise the money to begin building the new center. In 1990, Gualala Redwoods, Inc. donated ten acres of beautiful redwood forestland near the Gualala River, and construction began in 1996. Two years later the Gualala Arts Center was dedicated, with a 15,000 square foot complex including a 300-seat capacity auditorium, stage, commercial kitchen, conference room, gallery, offices, classrooms, amphitheater, courtyard, and sculpture garden.

The people of Gualala and its neighboring communities have given generous financial support, as well as equipment, supplies, building materials, and countless hours of volunteer labor. As a result, the facility is debt-free and hosts over 1,500 meetings and events each year, including classes, concerts, community events, theatrical performances, films, lectures, and extraordinary exhibits. The Art Center may also be rented for weddings and private social events. With dedicated leadership and hundreds of hard-working volunteers, the Gualala Arts Center continues to fulfill its mission to promote public interest and participation in the arts.
