10:00 a.m. Gate Opens - \$6 admission fee. Children 12 and under are free. Artists participating in the exhibit are admitted free with a stamped entry form. Readers of this newsletter can use the coupon on page 8 for a two admissions for the price of one which is a \$6 savings.



Juried artist vendors will again be selling items including jewelry, ceramics, wood, tiles, weavings, handmade apparel, leather goods, photographs, textiles, and artwork in booths. Here is a chance to get unique hand-made gifts for yourself or friends. Get acquainted with the artists; see hundreds of one-of-kind items made especially for this event. Enjoy shopping among the tall redwoods with friends and family.

Service clubs and local businesses will set up barbeque, beverage, baked goods, and ice cream booths.

A membership booth will help you sign up to become a member, find your place in the volunteers, or show you how you can help fund events and activities at Gualala Arts.

In addition, Gualala Arts will host a children's booth where, under adult supervision, kids can use available materials to create their own art to take home.

12:00 p.m. Storytelling for Children will be held in the Fairy Ring (an unusual grouping of redwoods and old burned out stumps) just behind the arts center. This event is sponsored by Joel and Jeremy Crockett of the Four-Eyed Frog book store in Gualala.

1:00 p.m. NEDO Band with Dorothy Wood on guitar and Neva Hauser on bass specializing in blues and folk music.

2:00 p.m. The Farallons Folk & Roll to fill your soul. The Farallons play their curiously recognizable acoustic music at festivals, concerts, and clubs throughout Northern and Central California. Terry Mills, Linda Weber, and Tom Richardson blend a cornucopia of styles to produce old-sounding music that is brand new.

3:00 p.m. Announcement of the People's Choice Award. Each year visitors vote for their favorite work in the Fine Art Exhibit. The winning artist gets a check for \$100.



3:00 p.m. Raffle winner of the handmade *Rainbow Dreams* quilt made by Lola DeLongoria, Joyce Gaudet, and Laura Hamilton, will be drawn and announced. Proceeds from the annual quilt raffle benefit the Gualala Arts Scholarship Program. Tickets are \$2 each, seven for \$10 or 15 for \$20.



3:15 p.m. The Farallons encore performance: The Farallons come from western rootstock. That is, the dust in their bones comes from the western third of the North American continent.
