#### Collaborative Art Show

The show will be juried by selecting proposals which must be received at Gualala Arts by **January 30**. All works must be made by two or more artists and of non-art materials or art materials used in a non-traditional way. The selected artists will be notified by February 12. The entry fee for accepted work is \$15 per artist per work. Exhibit will be in the Jacob Foyer from June 9 to July 8. Pickup of artwork is on Monday, July 9. Curators are Hansine Goran, Sue Friedland, & Jane Reichhold.

Poets are invited to show the art of their words in the Coleman Auditorium from April 14 – May 6. Registration forms and \$5 per entry must be received by **April 2**. #### Gualala Arts Young Artist Scholarships

Up to \$5000 in scholarships is available to graduating seniors whose residence is in the region served by Gualala Arts – Fort Ross to Elk. Students active and committed to continue their studies and pursue a career in art are encouraged to apply. Art is broadly defined to include painting, drawing, sculpture, music, ceramics, jewelry, drama, dance, writing, film, photography, computer art, and other appropriate fields. In previous years, scholarships up to \$2000 have been awarded to students engaged in theater arts, dance, clay arts, drawing, painting, film, fashion design, and photography.

Any graduating senior who is a resident of Gualala Arts region, has strong motivation, and demonstrated abilities, interest, and productivity is eligible. He or she must have definite plans to enroll in an appropriate school, college, or university for art studies with a commitment to enroll in an appropriate art program or classes. The application must be typed, concise, focused, and complete to be considered. The Scholarship Committee will interview finalists at a time and place to be arranged in mid-April. If you are selected as a finalist, you should be prepared to bring to your interview examples of your work, your portfolio, or other suitable representations of your work. 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### Community Foundation 2007 Grant Programs

#### Arts For Our Future: enhancing the economy of Mendocino County through the arts

Arts for Our Future is designed to establish mutually beneficial, long-standing relationships between successful arts organizations, artists, and/or artist cooperatives and the businesses and/or non-arts organizations in the communities in which they reside. By doing so, the Community Foundation hopes to inspire innovative programming that enhances both the artistic and economic life of the county. Aggregate grant amount awarded: up to \$77,000. Application deadline: **February 16, 2007.**

#### Community Enrichment: reflecting the community's commitment to enhancing the lives of others

This grant program is available to non-profit organizations that are based in Mendocino County or to any organization with a project that has specific benefit to Mendocino County residents. Its intention is to fund projects that are undertaken to benefit the general public. Aggregate grant amount awarded: up to \$100,000 (grant range: \$500 - \$6,500). Application deadline: **March 9, 2007.**

#### D. Abramson Visual Arts Award For Art in Public Places

This grant program is for public entities or non-profit organizations that partner with visual artists residing in the northern section of the Mendocino Coast (Elk to Westport). The Community Foundation will fund one or two grants for the creation of art that will be permanently displayed in public places (e.g., park, civic building, library, district hospital, city street). Aggregate grant amount awarded: up to \$4,800. Application deadline: **March 9, 2007.**
