Jazz Poet ruth weiss Performs with Trio Saturday, April 14 at 7:30 p.m

For the third year Gualala Arts joins The Friends of the Coast Community Library for a poetry reading during National Poetry Month. This year ruth weiss, described by Herb Caen as "the Beat Generation goddess who launched jazz poetry readings at The Cellars in the 60's," will appear in Gualala Arts Center's Coleman Auditorium.



In 1990 she won the Bay Area "Poetry Slam" and released Volume 1 of her two-volume album "Poetry and All that Jazz." In 1996 "The Brink," a film she wrote, directed, and narrated with jazz was shown at The Whitney Museum of American Art.

In October 2006, ruth weiss was awarded a medal for excellence in cultural achievement in Vienna, Austria, during a festival honoring her. She continues to perform with her jazz collaborators on the last Monday of every month at The Gathering Caffé on Grant Street, in San Francisco.

For those who missed the Beat scene the first time, or for those who want to relive those carefree, iconoclastic days once more, this performance by a poet who has never stopped performing her work over the last fifty years is a must event. Donations will be gratefully accepted.
