


## STUDIO DISCOVERY TOUR CATALOGS

## NEXT SUMMER SATURDAY ART FEST

**Saturday, July 7 from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m.**

On the weekend after the Fourth of July, Gualala Arts will sponsor the Summer Saturday Art Fest under the direction of Scott Chieffo.



Booths and marketplace stands will be set up in the commons behind the Gualala Hotel, adjacent to Sundstrom Mall, with the chance that if there is an overflow, some

booths may also be across the street in front of the Dolphin.

Each of these festivals brings an increasing number of artists and artisans to downtown Gualala, where they exhibit their most recent works. These open-air events allow the public the opportunity to view and purchase fine art and quality crafts directly from their creators. A variety of fine art, photography, ceramics, jewelry, glass, woodworks, and more will be on display, rain or shine.

## ART IN THE REDWOODS PLANNING WELL UNDERWAY



The Art in the Redwoods Festival, the most popular and largest art show on the Redwood Coast in California, will take place on the 3rd weekend in August and runs through Labor Day weekend. Artists and artisans are invited to show and sell their works and to compete for generous awards, which include cash prizes, ribbons, and art supply gift certificates.

Entry forms for the indoor exhibit, complete with entry rules, available category options, awards, and map to Gualala Arts Center, are available to download from [www.GualalaArts.org](http://www.GualalaArts.org).

Deadline for entries must be post marked by the 3rd Monday in July. The first 420 entries will be accepted, entries received after that will be put on a waiting list. You must be a member of Gualala Arts (you may join when turning in your form), and there is \$10 fee for each piece with a maximum of 2 pieces per artist. The artwork must be dropped off in person on the second Sunday in August. We do not accept mailed artwork.

This year the gala opening will be held on Thursday night with seating beginning at 6 p.m. for the Top Hat Dinner. During the evening a painting by Duane Gordon will be auctioned off to the highest bidder as a fund-raiser. Friday night kicks off with a Champagne Preview of the Fine Arts Exhibit from 4 - 7 p.m. Admission is \$10, including the souvenir wine glass. Artists entered into the fine art exhibit are admitted free. Award presentations and judges' critique will take place Friday at 6 p.m. in the outdoor amphitheater. Artists should be present to receive awards but are not required. Outdoor Artist Vendor booths will be open for a sneak preview from 4 - 6 p.m.

Saturday from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. and Sunday 10 a.m. to 4 p.m. the festival is open to the public for the indoor fine art exhibition, outdoor artists vendor booths, food & drink booths, live local music, and family entertainment! Admission is \$6 for adults and is free for children under the age of 12. Plan now to attend and bring your guests for local color and entertainment.
