Carmina Slovenica Concert Tuesday, October 30, 8:30 p.m.



The concert choir Carmina Slovenica, with its conductor Karmina Šilec, is one of the leading young women's ensembles in choral music worldwide. The choir has a central position on the Slovenian and international music scene. It has performed on concert stages worldwide –

from the Hong Kong Cultural Centre to the Teatro Colon in Buenos Aires.

Carmina Slovenica has been invited to perform at music events of the highest esteem such as the World Symposium on Choral Music, Eastern Festival in Moscow, Dresdner Musikfestspiele, European Symposium on Choral Music, Polyfollia, America Cantat, Choir Olympics, and Europa Cantat. With "Choregie - vocal theatre," Carmina Slovenica introduces new concepts which incorporate music, drama, movement and other stage elements in award winning productions performed at many international festivals and broadcast by European Broadcasting Union and Eurovision.

Founded in 1998 in San Francisco, and currently the Ensemble-in-Residence at Chicago's DePaul University School of Music, the Jupiter Trio is renowned for its passionate and dedicated approach to the piano trio repertoire. Widely praised for its mesmerizing energy in performance, the Jupiter Trio won first prize at the Fourth Osaka International Chamber Music Competition in 2002. Chosen from fifty-four ensembles representing nineteen countries, the Jupiter Trio became the first American ensemble in the history of the competition to bring home the gold medal.
