Interested in improving your photography? The Gualala Arts Library (GAL) has approximately 300 books/videos on the constantly evolving photographic arts. The collection includes histories, "how to improve" technically and a number of "coffee table" books by such artists as Flor Garduno, Steve Crouch, Walker Evans, Huntington Witherill, Alfred Steiglitz, Eliot Porter, Galen Rowell, Anne Leibowitz and of course, Ansel Adams.
