Tour leaders Karel Metcalf and Jim Littlejohn are enthusiastic about this year's itinerary which offers glorious hiking opportunities in five spectacular locations: Luzern, Saanen (near Gstaad), Saas-Fee (near Zermatt), Samedan (near St. Moritz) and Wengen (under the Jungfrau). Your Swissrail Pass takes you to the trailhead, should it not be outside your hotel door, and gives you access to all of Switzerland. From each of these five picturesque and historic towns it is possible to go by cable car to one of the 10,000 foot peaks on "the roof of the Alps" for sweeping vistas which take in almost all of Switzerland. **The dates are September 2 to October 1, 2008. 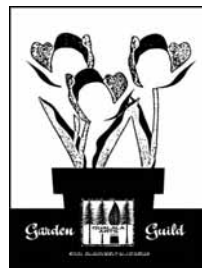
