This exhibit is all about the hidden treasures of the Mendocino-Sonoma coastal region.

Ask any artist what inspires and influences their art and most will reply that their surroundings or environment are key factors.

For the seven artists highlighted in this exhibit, all of whom live along this narrow coastal strip, inspiration comes easily from the unique shapes, lines and colors created by the angular cliffs hugging the sea shore, redwood forests and broad meadows bordered by massive Cypress.

Participating artists include Jane Head, ceramics and paintings; Bruce Jones, watercolors, drawings and sculptures; Judy Pfeifer, drawings, mixed media, fiber arts, paintings; Jennie Henderson, textile arts; Mike Henderson, drawing, mixed media and ceramics; Ling-Yen Jones, jewelry; and Marilyn Green, photography and mixed media.

The Hidden Treasures artists' works are diverse, and whether realistic or abstract, come from their life experiences of living in such a rich and stimulating environment.





## 4th Annual Salon & Salon des Refuses

The annual Gualala Salon & Salon des Refusés is a juried and judged fine art show. The exhibit showcases outstanding visual art and artists without regard to the type of media. Prizes are awarded to first, second and third selections and accepted into the Salon exhibited in the Burnett Gallery. Artwork not juried into the Salon is displayed in the Salon des Refusés (Rejected) in the Elaine Jacob Foyer. Thus, all submitted artwork will be exhibited at Gualala Arts.

The original Salon des Refusés was an 1863 Paris art exhibition showcasing works rejected by the official Paris Salon judges. The Salon judges represented the French Academy and advocated traditional orthodox painting and sculpture. That year almost 3,000 artworks were rejected, resulting in protests. Emperor Napoleon III ordered a new exhibition - dubbed the "Salon des Refuses" - that allowed the public to judge the artwork.

In the Gualala Salon, three prizes will be awarded to art accepted into the Salon – First Prize \$1,000, Second Prize \$750, and Third Prize \$500. In addition to the judge's awards, every visitor may vote for a favorite Salon des Refuse art piece. The "People's Choice Awards" are 1st prize \$100, 2nd prize \$75, and 3rd prize \$50. A special judge award will go to best work by an artist under 18 years of age.

This year's Salon art work will be judged by Michael Newhall. Newhall has dedicated his adult life to art-making, mostly as a teacher or student, and always as an artist. He received an MFA from the Art Institute of Chicago and studied at University of Wisconsin and Art Students League of New York. As a teacher, he has taught art at the Art Institute of Chicago, Naropa University and



## Let Them Eat Cake!

“Let them eat cake!” is one of the most famous quotes in history. Some time around 1789, when told her French subjects had no bread, Marie-Antoinette (bride of France’s King Louis XVI) supposedly sniffed, “Qu’ils mangent de la brioche” – “Let them eat cake.” With that callous remark, the queen became a hated symbol of the decadent monarchy that eventually led to her to (literally) losing her head. Marie-Antoinette probably didn’t say those words, but it’s a good excuse to eat cake and drink champagne!

Back by popular demand for the second year, in addition to the Fine Art Competition of the Gualala Salon is a separate Fine Art Cake Contest. Artists are encouraged to create Fine Art Cakes that will be judged on artistic merit, not taste. Attendees to the opening reception for the Gualala Salon and Let Them Eat Cake! will get to eat the cakes, washing them down with champagne or a fresh beverage of their choice.

First Prize is \$250, Second Prize \$175, and Third prize \$100. In addition there will be an Emerging Artist Award of \$100 for the best cake by an artist under 18 years of age.

For this exhibit, artists are encouraged to use any ingredients, keeping mind judging is on artistic merit and not taste – although taste could be a tie breaker. All entries must be 40% edible. There is no size requirement or limitation with respect to the size of the cake. All artists must be present to cut their cake(s).

Cakes will be judged at 4 pm on the day of the opening reception for the show, and will be on view from 5 to 6 pm, at which time artists will cut their cakes and attendees will enjoy the spoils of the artists’ labors!
