### *The mother lode . . .*

The red crown crane is depicted in many Asian paintings and considered a holy creature symbolizing good fortune, prosperity and longevity. Our annual Pacific Piecemakers Quilt Guild Art in the Redwoods raffle prize features cranes this year.

I was surprised to learn that the geranium flower comes from the Greek word geranos, which means crane. The flower reminded ancient Grecians of a crane's bill, so they named it after it.

## Putting it all Together: collage & assemblage

Collage is one of the fastest growing and popular methods of art-making in the 21st century. Accessible to everyone, collage involves tearing or cutting, pasting and reassembling fragments of paper, fabrics, found objects and ephemera into a new art piece. This show is offered by the Gualala Arts Collage User Group. Sharon Nickodem is curator of this show.

Assemblage incorporates three-dimensional found objects and the process of creating a collage/assemblage may include analog and digital methods, or both. When a collage or assemblage is completed, a transformation has occurred.

***Nowhere else in art-making does synchronicity and intention have such impact as when they collide and integrate in the making of collage art!***

This show will NOT be juried, but it will be judged and moderate prizes will be awarded in the following categories: Best of Show, Analog, Digital, and Collaborative. Paul Schulte, of Schulte Design, a San Francisco-based graphic design and creative arts firm, will judge the show.

The Gualala Arts Collage User Group meets monthly on the second and fourth Tuesdays, noon to 4 pm. Cost is \$5 per session and it is a "drop-in" open studio setting with space limited to 15 users at a time. The group meets in the upstairs classroom at the Arts



## Nature's Gift

"Having the desire to create without limitations" gave rise to David Allen's business California Brothers Design (calibrothers.com), which, for now, focuses on capturing the cannabis plant.

Born in Oakland, Allen has lived on the Mendocino Coast for over 28 years with his wife, Lucienne, raising five kids. Now an empty-nester, he has re-engaged his passion for photography, which began in the mid-1990's. And, while he still has a working dark room, he admits to finally embracing the digital realm.

In this work, Allen's goal was to highlight the cannabis plant with the flower at its medicinal peak, rendering its most unusual combination of colors, with every strain being different from the next. He then printed the images on metal. Allen works with farmers, cultivators, and geneticists alike helping them immortalize their unique strains, showcasing each distinct variety in detail.

## Stories from a Disorganized Mind

"Don't tell anyone, but sometimes I just make stuff up. It really is more fun that way. At least for me it is." This is how Jim Vickery describes his work as an aartist.

While he sometimes starts a painting with a fully formed idea and executes it as imagined, he says most of the time the idea changes, develops, and grows out of the process. "There is a dialogue between paint and painter -- a give and take that often results in as much surprise as intention."

"Surprise is a great motivator for painting this way. But sometimes I just walk in the studio, face the blank space, no ideas, no intentions or expectations and well, just make stuff up. Don't tell, okay?"

## Peggy Sebera, oil paintings

Peggy Sebera focuses quietly and intently on detail - the shimmering shape of a single flower blossom, for instance - that invites viewers into intimate contact. Working in oil on large canvases, Sebera evokes the natural world to which she is so attentive to. In her words, she brings the object of her gaze "to life as fully as possible... it feels as if I am there listening to nature reveal its magic to me."

Sebera was an active Girl Scout who loved nature. "The listening to nature that I did (as a Scout) morphed into the listening to individuals and groups as I worked as a leadership coach in organizations for many years." Along the way, however, she attended an art workshop in Europe and, after raising two children, launched a second career as a painter. Viewers will resonate to the sheer joy and quiet repose these paintings call forth.

## Jan Maria Chiappa, clay & textiles

Jan Maria holds a Bachelor of Fine Arts and an MA with a concentration in Scripture and Ethics. She says her interest in the normative and formative power of myth eventually led to her study of scriptural stories and how they form our ethical structures. "The narrative we claim and tell about who we are, where we come from, and how we relate to the earth and one another informs our lives."

Jan Maria's study of fine art technique and myth leads her naturally to work formed in the human story and in that story's interaction with the natural world. Jan Maria's work includes clay work batik, drawing, painting, and textile work.

In this exhibit her fascinating and functional pieces in black clay and white porcelain reflect the influence of the Mendonoma Coast, whose sometimes austere, often lush landscapes, textures, and colors inform her work.



### ENTRY QUALIFICATIONS

Entries limited to three (3) entries per artist

- Each Entry must:
  - Be an Original - one of a kind or one of a limited edition of numbered multiples
  - Gualala Arts carries no inventory of multiples
  - Artists responsible for delivery of multiple sales
  - Prints & Graphics produced in multiples must be numbered and signed by the artist
  - Entered by a living artist who created the entry within the last two (2) years
  - Never have been exhibited in Art in the Redwoods before

### SIZE AND WEIGHT

- Single wall hung entry maximum of 60" wide
- Second wall hung entry maximum of 48" wide or less
- Third wall hung entry maximum of 48" wide or less
- Diptych and Triptych entries maximum of 60" wide
  - Diptych and Triptych entries are one entry each and cannot be sold as individual pieces
- 70 lb. weight limit for each entry
- Any entry may be refused if it:
  - is exceptionally fragile
  - space is not available
  - does not adhere to these Exhibition Rules
- See *Exceptions and Special Circumstances for Glass entries and additional Weight information.*

### PREPARING ENTRIES

- Ensure paintings are thoroughly dry
- Picture Frames:
  - Must be strong and will be tested for sturdiness
  - Avoid plastic or clip frames – Plexiglass recommended
  - Use strong metal picture wire minimum of 2" affixed so that wire or hanger will not show when hung (saw tooth hangers discouraged)
  - Jewelry and small sculptures should be in display cases or shadow box frames for protection
  - Fabric entries must have hanging tabs/sleeves with rod/dowel labeled with artist's name

### ARTIST/ENTRY INFORMATION

- Exhibit Artist Binder will be available for one sheet per entry (description, artist statement, artist bio, etc.)

- No supplementary materials allowed next to or around entries (labels, books, promotional materials etc.)

### EXCEPTIONS AND SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES

#### Weight & Glass Information & Exception

- Entries within the weight limit – artists are requested to assist in handling large 3-dimensional artwork or furnish display stands if artwork requires
- Entries exceeding weight limit – artists are required to participate in placement. Special intake required\*\*
- Glass entries proposed to be suspended, are fragile or complex – Artists are required to participate in entry placement. Special intake required\*\*

#### Outdoor Entries Information

- Must be non-permanent and removable
- Must remain outdoors for the duration of exhibit
- Must be installed by Friday August 10.

\*\* Special Intake on August 9 must be scheduled in advance – call (707) 884-1138 to schedule an appointment.

### FEES

- Membership in Gualala Arts is required in addition to Exhibit Entry Fee
  - Single Membership \$30
  - Family Membership \$50
- Exhibit Entry Fees:
  - \$10 per entry
  - \$20 per entry not for sale (NFS)
  - Entry Fees for Artists under 18 years old are waived
  - Entry Fees are non-refundable
- \$5 Fee will be charged for changes/addition to the Entry Form after submission
 

*Special Note: The completeness of your entry form is important. Changes made after the Entry Form deadline will not be reflected in the IGO "Art in the Redwoods Official Show Program"*
- Proof of insurance may be required for work priced over \$5000

### COMMISSIONS

- Gualala Arts will retain 30% commission on all entry (or multiples) sales
- Artist payment checks will be issued within two weeks of the end of the month in which sale was made
- It is Gualala Arts policy to request the artist to submit to Gualala Arts 10% of any future sales generated as a result of the Art in the Redwood Exhibit

**ENTRY PROCEDURE**

- Complete the 2018 Entry Form for up to three (3) entries
- Print Clearly
- Fill in all entries accurately (see reference in fees)
- Submit with total fee due no later than July 9

  - Call 707.884.1138 to arrange fee payment
  - Deliver Entry form and fee(s) directly to Gualala Arts
- Entries are not accepted until fee(s) are paid
- Total entries for the exhibit are limited to 350
- Entries received are published weekly on our website [www.gualalaarts.org](http://www.gualalaarts.org)

**ARTWORK DELIVERY**

- Deliver artwork, 12 p.m.–4p.m., Sunday August 12, to Gualala Arts Center, 46501 Old State Hwy., Gualala
- Deliver in person at the above designated time
- Shipped or mailed entries are not accepted. No exceptions!
- Special intake on Thursday, August 9 must be scheduled in advance - call 707.884.1138 to schedule an appointment (see EXCEPTIONS AND SPECIAL CIRCUMSTANCES)
- Removable labels will be produced and attached by Gualala Arts to the back of each entry upon take-in
- On take-in day you will be provided:
  - Artist receipt for claiming unsold artwork at exhibit close
  - One AIR festival admission ticket per entry

**POST SHOW/PICK—UP**

- Unsold artwork must stay up for entire exhibit
- Buyers will be requested to leave purchase through Sunday August 19 or as long as possible but may take upon purchase
- Artist must claim unsold artwork Monday, September 10, 12 p.m. – 4 p.m. or Tuesday September 11, 10 a.m. – 4 p.m.

- Artist of Sales receipt will be used for ownership or proof of purchase at pick—up
- Artwork must be signed out
- Gualala Arts not responsible for the art left after 4 p.m. September 4
- \$5 daily storage fee assessed to artist for unclaimed artwork after September 4

## Take a Trip to Asia!

While the deadline for registration has passed, it's not too late to sign up for Global Harmony Summer Adventure Camp! If you have young people visiting the area who are looking for things to do, we will be cooking up fun at Gualala Arts Global Harmony Summer Adventure Camp from Tuesday, July 10 to Friday, July 20.

This year's classes include Japanese fish painting, or Gyo-taku, block printing on textiles, making books with sun prints and calligraphy, anthropology and cultural lessons, Asian cuisine, and even some Martial Arts!

Some of our teachers this year are local and some have travelled a long way to spend time with your kids and grandkids!

Jessica Crouch will be leading the workshop on Gyo-taku and block printing. Originally used to record and commemorate a fisherman's catch, fish prints are created with sumi ink on paper, using a real fish! Block prints will be hand-colored on cotton fabric using natural dyes and paint brushes. Jessica lives in Nashville, Tenn.

Instructor JC Johnson will teach book binding and cyanotype. JC has a Master of Fine Arts with a Photography Concentration and has worked as a teacher and staff photographer. She is currently Artistic Director of Culture Keeper Online Journal. She is based in Nashville, Tenn.

Local Martial Arts instructor Lini Lieberman will teach some beginning moves and routines in Karate and the Martial Arts and with local anthropologist Anne Menne, campers will re-trace the steps of Asian ancestors, working in tribes. Executive Director David "Sus" Susalla will lead the Asian cooking classes.




Burkhardt's second place poem was "The Ballerina."
