

Donnalynn and Mark Chase enjoy collecting old things. They share a fascination and respect for obsolete mechanisms and ephemera; specifically, scientific instruments and books. For over 20 years, they have channeled their passion for antique objects and collecting into their art making. Mark prefers creating artifacts from brass and minerals that artfully represent antique

scientific instruments and models, while Donnalynn works primarily with antique and vintage papers. "Papers & Brass of the Past" is their first exhibit together showcasing Mark's sculptures and a new collage series by Donnalynn.

Mark is self-taught artist who has been influenced by years of working in the aerospace industry with precise and articulate requirements. Brass, bronze or copper and beautiful minerals are the dominate materials in his objects d' arte. Now retired here on the coast, Mark is continuing to make one-of-a-kind "new" designs of ancient models embodying the marriage of art and science. This exhibit will be presenting many different versions of his planetary visions.

Over 60 new six inch square collages made on used game boards with antique and vintage images will be shown by Donnalynn. This series, "WTF?", started in January 2018, in response to her need to have more fun. She wanted to make a collage a week to guarantee her "fun" and to have a new body of work for this show. This series reflects Donnalynn's year in quirky vignettes and strange snapshots. For fun, she challenged herself to create images that seemingly do not relate to each other; to create something not known to her. The fantastical juxtapositions are meant to encourage the viewer to look closely and question what they are looking at. Is anything really what it appears?

Collage came naturally to Donnalynn through her obsession with collecting books and all kinds of ephemera. She now focuses on how to incorporate her "stuff" into new projects. Hunting for that perfect old book or antique ephemera is still one of her favorite things to do. A unique quality of Donnalynn's art work is that she very rarely uses photocopies or digital resources as she prefers to use the original paper materials.

Currently, both Mark's and Donnalynn's art is on display at Discovery Gallery in Gualala.

The aim of the Girls Choir of Hamburg is the professional promotion of the vocal and musical development of children and adolescents as part of a committed and open-minded choir community. From the beginning, the girls develop sensitivity for proper vocal handling, different choral sounds and collaborative music making. An essential part of the choral work are the concert tours featuring



ing the Girls Choir of Hamburg.

Reviews for the choir have been outstanding. They’ve been described in superlatives for the depth and breadth of their performances,

**Formosa Quartet
Chamber Series presents**

**Debora Pae, cellist; Wayne Lee, violinist;
Che-Yen Chen, violist; Jasmine Lin, violin.**

The members of Formosa Quartet – Jasmine Lin, Wayne Lee, Che-Yen Chen, and Deborah Pae – have established themselves as leading solo, chamber, and orchestral musicians. With degrees from the Juilliard School, Curtis Institute of Music, and New England Conservatory, they have performed in major venues throughout the United States, Asia, and Europe and have consistently given critically acclaimed performances.



They've recorded on the EMI, New World Records, and Delos labels.

Formed in 2002 when the four founding members came together for a concert tour of Taiwan, Formosa Quartet is deeply committed to championing Taiwanese music and promoting the arts in the land of its heritage, as well as exploring diverse and adventurous mediums for string quartet.

In 2013 the members of Formosa Quartet founded the annual Formosa Chamber Music Festival (FCMF), where they continue to serve as artist faculty. Based in Hualien, Taiwan, and modeled after American summer festivals such as Marlboro, Ravinia, the Taos School of Music, and Kneisel Hall, FCMF is the result of collective long-held aspirations and years of planning and represents one of the Quartet's primary missions: to bring high-level chamber music training to talented young musicians in Taiwan, while simultaneously offering first-rate music to Taiwanese audiences of all ages.

In 2014-2016 Formosa enjoyed a two-year residency with San Diego arts-presenting organization Art of Élan; as ensemble-in-residence, the Quartet worked with UCSD professor of composition Lei Liang to create a new piece based on music indigenous to the aboriginal tribes of Taiwan. The two-year project culminated in the 2016 premiere performance of the commission, **Song Recollections**, and looks ahead to a new CD of the same name, inspired by Hungarian and Taiwanese folk music traditions.

We have two main spaces for exhibits at the Gualala Arts Center: the Burnett Gallery and the Jacob Foyer. In addition, Gualala Arts presents exhibits at the Dolphin Gallery, our members' gallery in downtown Gualala, and we occasionally have exhibits in Coleman Hall, our performing arts theater.

The Burnett Gallery is perfect for exhibiting work with controlled lighting needs. The off-white walls and new hardwood flooring allow the art pieces to take center stage. The gallery is a separate space with no through-traffic which allows exhibit options not available in the foyer. The open ceiling design provides additional creative exhibition space while still maintaining an intimate art experience.

The Jacob Foyer is lit primarily with natural lighting from the large front windows. Its two-story wall heights are conducive for showing large wall pieces and the beautiful slate floor and wood paneled staircase create a warm, friendly atmosphere. In addition to the walls, sculpture is often exhibited in this space, while being sensitive to not impeding the traffic flow through this area.

The Exhibit Committee welcomes new concepts and proposals. We suggest you read the documents online to help you understand how to write your proposal, know what you will be responsible for as a curator, and how and when the Exhibition Committee functions.

Gualala Arts and Ferrellgas: Working Together to Create a New Member Benefit




Most of our members use propane to warm their homes, heat their water, or cook their food, and Gualala Arts members are signing up with Ferrellgas to save money.

Individuals, families, and businesses that are member-supporters of Gualala Arts can switch to Ferrellgas and take advantage of their **discounted rate on propane. Gualala Arts members will be charged \$1.00 over Ferrellgas's cost.** At press time, the current price for members of Gualala Arts is \$2.56 per gallon. That rate may be a little higher or lower depending on when you sign up. As always, prices will fluctuate, but your price will be pegged to the Ferrellgas cost price at the time of each propane delivery.


