The following is an update of our current situation as of today, April 30, 2020.

The doors are still closed to the public until May 10 (at the very earliest and perhaps into the summer to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19 as mandated by our county and state. We have cancelled dozens of our events, workshops, fundraisers & exhibits through May, June July & beyond. Some of the things that we are doing currently to further our mission to promote the arts include:

- We are **using our creativity to reimagine our future to continue our mission** “to promote public interest and participation in the arts.”
- **Gualala Arts Board of Directors has created a new board subcommittee to research and implement new virtual art experiences.** This group is headed up by board member Joan Wood and includes board members, staff, artists and interested community members. They are taking on **workshops as Webinars, exploring virtual exhibits and other tech savvy experiences** so that folks can continue to develop their skill-sets and explore new media from the safety of home. If you have ideas or would like to get involved, please contact joan@sharkwerks.com
- **THANK YOU! Your membership renewals and donations are making a difference** to keep our staff employed, bills paid, organization strong, and planning and adapting for our future. We have received many donations from \$5-22K from first time donors to seasoned Arts Angels. Each dollar raised makes a difference! Thank You, Thank You, Thank You!!!!
- **We have applied for several SBA and government loans and grants** to help us through this temporary transition of no program, event or rental revenue streams. We have not received any of these funds to date, but we are in line with many other non-profits and small businesses.
- **We are hosting a virtual exhibit titled, “Inferno: One Man’s Journey of the Camp Fire Through Art” by Artist Brian Holderman.** Works of art are for sale through our office by emailing Kendra info@gualalaarts.org.
- **Groups are using zoom to continue meeting:** board of directors, finance committee, staff, dialogue group, artist to artist mixer, life drawing, and coastal singers are some of the groups that are re-thinking how to continue to gather, meet, create, connect as we adjust to our new definition of “space.”
- **Posting our current Arts in the School exhibit to our social media sites** in a virtual gallery setting so the families and young artists can experience their work.
- **Planning a new exhibit entitled Shelter from the Storm: Art in the Time of Covid-19.** We encourage artists & non-artists alike to create art while sheltering in their homes. We are looking forward to seeing what everyone has been working on to keep himself or herself busy while sheltering in their homes. Artists are posting using the **hash tags #shelterfromthestormart & #gualalaarts.**
- **Trent Kreck Painting completed our project of refinishing the siding to help to prevent mold and bugs from coming back.**
- **Thankfully, we have signed a lease in a prime location in Uptown Gualala which we hope will prove to be very successful for the Gualala Arts Gallery & Dolphin Gift Shop.** Of course, this will require funds for the relocation, signage and store set-up.
- **As always, our Sketches newsletter is available online,** but we will not be mailing Sketches in May and into the future as warranted to save resources.

These are uncertain time for all of us to say the least. **The board and finance committees are making prudent decisions with our Gualala Arts assets.** If you find that you are in a position to help with the loss of our revenue stream, it would be greatly appreciated. We are looking to continue our mission – to promote public interest & participation in the arts since 1961 – well into the future.

Inferno: One Man's Journey of The Camp Fire through Art **The Art of Brian Holderman**

"A life once led by emotional turmoil wrought by the Camp Fire has now been healed through art's power to visually share a story of hope." That's the lens through which Brian Holderman creates his art. Gualala Arts' virtual exhibit—"Inferno: One Man's Journey of The Camp Fire through Art"—is a multi-faceted exhibit of Holderman's work including his paintings, photographs and now video clips.



All of this has evolved out of Brian Holderman's experience of being trapped for eight-hours in the blaze that devastated Paradise California comes to life through 10 paintings, 20 photographs, and five video clips. On that fateful day, Holderman was at work in Chico, but decided to return to Paradise to rescue his two dogs, including one that was Bear, a service dog at the school where he was the principal. "I knew the students would be devastated if anything happened to Bear. What I

didn't realize is the emotional affect the experience would have on me."

A transplant to Gualala, he made the move permanent after visiting the area and realizing the Mendonoma Coast was a place that could embrace him and help him express his healing through art. . When he visited the area in April 2019 he realized that "This was the first time I felt I could truly breathe without the memories of the Camp Fire. This was such a healing place. During that weekend, I made the decision to move to the area. I lost everything in the Camp Fire and what better place to start over."

The virtual exhibit has now added a video section featuring 7 clips that are just a click away. One clip shows the local Safeway store enveloped in flames. Another shows what appear to be little spot fires that in another time could be assumed to be decorative lights during the holidays. Perhaps nothing is more powerful than the view from Brian's car as he drives up his old street and realizes the only one house is standing (not his) and all that's remains of his home is a metal sculpture in front of the ashes of his home. The longest clip is an interview with Brian talking about the experience, where he emotionally replays his personal experience that day in Paradise. Holderman's paintings have allowed him to release the pain he had inside. The final painting in the series is titled, Hope. This painting depicts vegetation peeking its way through the devastation. "It is an exhibit about what happened to me on that day but ending with hope that things will rejuvenate and come back.

“A Star Is Born” The 2020 Challenge from Pacific Piecemakers Quilt Guild

Pacific Piecemakers Quilt Guild has become a dynamic organization of artists promoting quilting along the Sonoma/Mendocino coast. PPQG offers monthly educational programs, lectures, and workshops for quilters of all skill levels as well as opportunities for members to give back to their community using those skills.

Each year Pacific Piecemakers Quilt Guild members are “challenged” to create a quilt that fits certain parameters. The 2020 Challenge is “A Star is Born.” Although no specific style nor size is required, this year each entry must include a “one pieced star”.

A pieced star can be any star design in any size and the quilt design can have the minimum one star or many stars as long as they are pieced.

Inspiration can come from absolutely anywhere or anything. Members are challenged to apply the Challenge rules to stitch and/or quilt their own interpretation in fabric in one, two or three dimensions.

Quilts to be exhibited include traditional, modern & art quilts, clothing, and a variety of styles & techniques.

The show is not juried nor judged, so it encourages creativity at all levels.



It is always a great thrill to see someone new to quilting/art quilts show their work alongside long-time quilters. Complete 2020 Challenge Rules are available at GualalaArts.org.

The PPQG holds regular meetings which are open to anyone who enjoys quilts or quilting or who would like to learn more. Newcomers and

visitors are always welcome; there is a \$5 charge for non-members. New members can join at any time for a \$40 per year membership fee.
