

# Marine Mammal Rescue Thursday, September 24, 7 p.m. \$5 Admission at the door



Sarah Winter Grimes shares her experiences as a Stranding and Rescue Volunteer for the Marine Mammal Center based in Sausalito. Like many other volunteers from Westport to San Luis Obispo, Winter Grimes is a first responder when someone calls the center to report a distressed marine mammal. She will discuss the commitment involved in being a rescue volunteer. It includes an orientation training and requires attending up to four additional workshops a year. She is one of around 20 active Fort Bragg Operations (FBO) volunteers. Additional volunteers are dispatched from Anchor Bay Operations (ABO). Together they cover an area from Fort Ross to the Lost Coast shoreline in Sinkyone Wilderness State Park. Currently rescue equipment bases are in Fort Bragg and on The Sea Ranch where there is also an active seal docent program.

After encountering a distressed California sea lion 12 years ago, Winter Grimes called the center hotline. She watched the rescue operation with fascination and signed up to be a volunteer. She now lives in Little River and grew up in Elk as a self-described "free range child" who loved nature. She has studied marine science at the College of the Redwoods and is an active birder. Winter Grimes points out 2015 is a particularly busy year for distressed seals and sea lions and there is always a need for more volunteers. Her talk will allow time for audience questions about the program. 
# New Logo Selected for Gualala Arts Theater!





Just in time for the coming autumn, Executive Chef Shannon Hughes will present a kitchen centered course on seasonal cooking. She is the former chef/owner of the successful Pangaea restaurants in Gualala and Pt. Arena. The Independent Coast Observer (8/7/15) quoted Shannon on her food philosophy: "My cuisine is devoted to the season's whimsy, to the practice of sustainable agriculture, to small organic farms and farmers, and to the great traditions of indigenous, unpretentious cooking."

Chef Shannon has extensive food preparation and restaurant experience on the Mendonoma Coast. During her seven years as chef/owner the Pangaea restaurants enjoyed an expanding patronage from local and Sonoma/Napa Valley wine country diners. # Kashaya Pomo History

The Gualala Arts 2015 lecture series concludes with an exceptional opportunity to learn about the Kashaya Pomo when Eric Wilder discusses the history of his people and the challenges of blending a traditional life style with the contemporary world. The talk

promises to provide insights into the world of the oldest residents of the Sonoma coast.

Wilder will begin with a brief history of the Kashaya band who had their first meaningful encounters with Europeans when the Russians settled Fort Ross. He will focus on his personal experiences learning tribal practices from his grandparents while growing up on the Stewarts Point Rancheria and on how he rediscovered his roots after working in the insurance business in Novato.

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# A Message from the Executive Director...

# R-E-S-P-E-C-T

I have been learning a lot about those 7 letters this month. It seems to be my mantra lately. I had the great pleasure to see Aretha Franklin live in Oakland California this month. You must remember her famous song "Respect." She did not disappoint and on her third encore she closed the show with it!

The standard definition of respect is a feeling of deep admiration for someone or something elicited by their abilities, qualities, or achievements.

I think to truly respect someone or a situation you need to take it a step further. Rarely do we try to look at the world from another person's perspective. I feel it is very important to try and find out how the other person you are communicating with is feeling. We usually come to a situation and conversation with a predetermined outcome conceived.



It is very common for us to think "enough about you, back to me."

We have a wide variety of people come into Gualala Arts.
