

1. Kneaded Rubber
2. Staedtler Mars Plastic White Eraser
3. 2mm drafting lead holders (I recommend at least two).
4. A lead pointer (I've included a photo of a lead holder and pointer).
5. 6B or 4B, 2B and HB 2mm leads (they usually come in packs of 12 sticks or in tubes of 2).

Regular wooden pencils are fine. However, the student should have a range like the kind listed above and a means to sharpen their pencils (i.e., an x-acto knife and or pencil sharpener).

6. Any sheet of white drawing paper: 8.5" x 11" or 9"x 12" (Utrecht, Canson, or Strathmore 400 series). This will be the general size we will be working in. It's better that the students use a paper with little "tooth." I recommend toned Stonehenge printmaking/drawing paper - excellent paper for drawing. "Toned" meaning that it has a slight grey color and value. It comes in 18" x 24" sheets and will need to be cut down.
7. Blending Stump
8. Masking Tape ($\frac{3}{4}$ " or 1")
9. A drawing board that will accommodate the size of the paper the students will be drawing on (no bigger than 18"x24").
