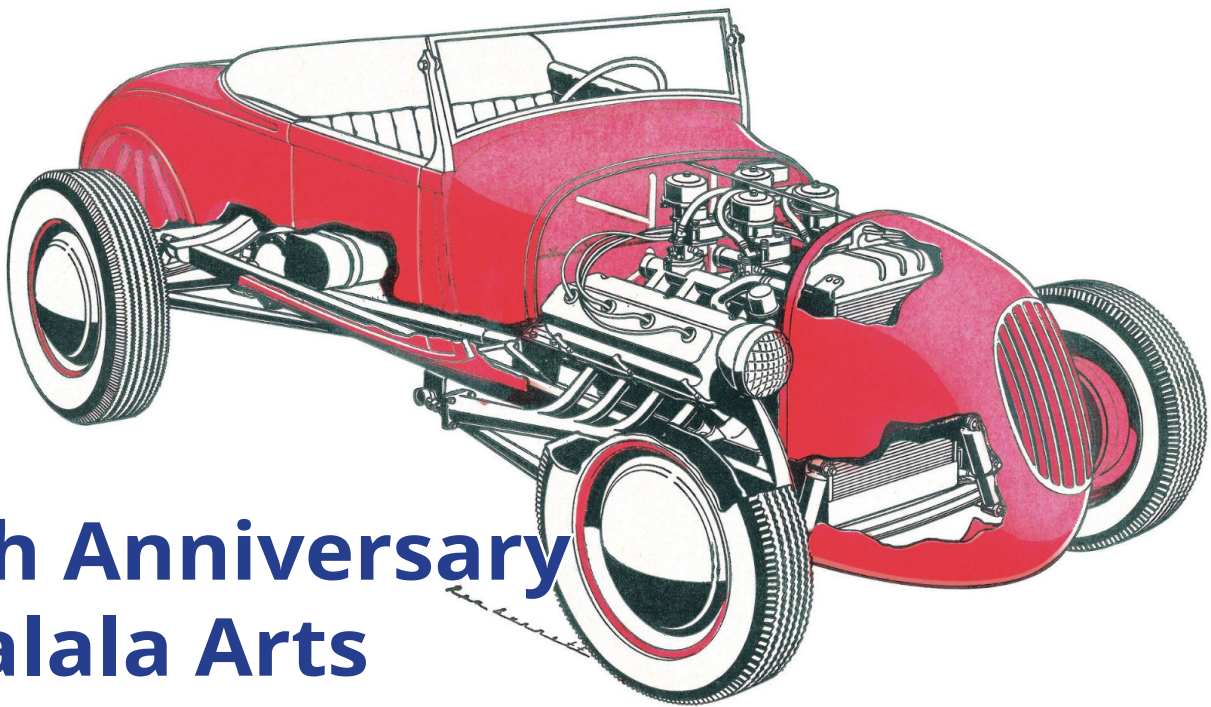

**YES-Coast Youth Program**  
*Youth Exploring the Sonoma Coast*

Youth Exploring the Sonoma Coast (Yes-Coast) connects youth to their scenic coastline by providing a year-long series of outdoor excursions.

Twenty-nine young people participated in the program last year, and this exhibit shows how they captured the experience. The PhotoVoice photography project integrates interactive educational, recreational, stewardship, leadership development and career exploration activities and events. The youth learned basic photography skills documenting their experiences and relationship with the coast through photography. At various settings along the Sonoma County coast, youth explored the basics of photography, including perspective, composition, portraiture, landscape photography and macro photography.

YES-Coast interweaves themes of local history, culture, and ecology during six outings and two camping trips that take place along the entire span of the Sonoma Coast. Many of the participants are experiencing the activities and coastal parks for the first time.

In addition to a nature and conservation focus, the approach integrated the relationships that people have with the ocean. Maritime culture and economy past and present, Kashia traditional practices on the coast, the history of Fort Ross, and young people's personal connections with the ocean.

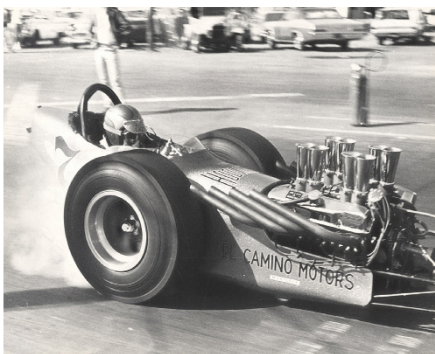

## Rex Burnett Auto Art

### and Carl "The Hooligan" Olson automobilia free

As part of the 2018 10th Anniversary of the Gualala Arts Auto Show and Pinewood Derby, Gualala Arts is proud to once again bring this excellent exhibit of Rex Burnett drawings to the Elaine Jacob Foyer. Rex was a long-time Sea Ranch resident and Gualala Arts patron. In the postwar '40s he worked as a technical illustrator in the aircraft industry while participating in the birth of the classic Hot Rod® magazine. The exhibit features his cutaway drawings done without the benefit of computers and 3-D CAD programs. These pieces have attracted attention from not only hot rod buffs but also from the art world.

He won the last Top Fuel dragster eliminator to be held at Lions. By 1976 he had finished his racing career and took a Vice President's role with the NHRA. His many years in the racing industry have earned him innumerable honors and trophies. Olson was owner and driver of The Hooligan dragster (pictured), which is how he earned his nickname.

Olson was the IHRA Top Fuel World Champion in 1972 and received the NHRA Lifetime Achievement Award in 2007. Olson was inducted into the British Drag Racing Hall of Fame in 2012.

Also on display will be automobilia from Carl "The Hooligan" Olson. Olson was a leader in the drag racing segment of the auto racing industry for decades, including a stint as National Hot Rod Association vice president for international relations.

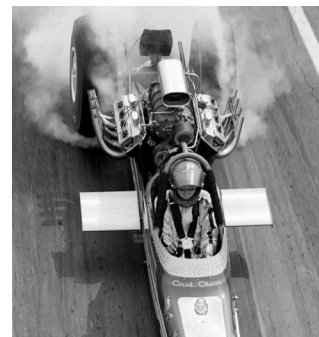

## Paul Brewer, photography

A pioneer in the technique of using metal as the base for photographs, Paul Brewer early on adopted the use of dye-infused metal prints, which have become increasingly popular. Today, all of his photographs are presented on metal.

Brewer notes that this is the third time his photographs have been featured at the Dolphin. For this show, he has chosen to combine some all-time customer favorites with brand new and never-before-seen works.

Brewer's photographs aim to capture, in stunning detail, the wildlife, seascapes, and landscapes of the northern California coast. As he says, his mission is to depict "the amazing wonders and natural beauty that surround us and to make those images available for others to enjoy at reasonable prices."

## Robert Rhoades, sculpture

"Content, context, and craft, the 'three C's,' are principles Robert Rhoades says he developed over four decades of teaching and creating, informing both his classical and contemporary work, which is also inspired by the spectacularly beautiful scenery of northern California.

Rhoades speaks passionately of two major influences in his life and art: teaching and travel. About teaching, he says that working to instill the fundamental principles of color, design, and drawing in "every student I have taught over my forty years in the profession" has guided his own development as an artist. And as to travel, Rhoades says "I cannot visit a major city in the world without drinking in the treasures of its museums."

During trips to Mexico, Europe, and Japan, Rhoades studied paper making with contemporary paper makers in each place he visited. His show at the Dolphin will emphasize his work in and of hand-made paper.





## 16th Annual Summer Chamber Music Weekend with Roy Bogas & Friends

This year's 16th Summer Chamber Music Weekend with Roy Bogas and Friends feature Roy's core group consisting of violinist Cordula Merks (concertmaster of the San Francisco Ballet Orchestra and assistant concertmaster of the Seattle Symphony) violinist Amy Hiraga, violist Nancy Ellis, and cellist Peter Wyrick, all three members of the San Francisco Symphony where Peter Wyrick is Associate Principal Cellist.

Roy Bogas, pianist, is also Principal Solo Pianist of the San Francisco Ballet Orchestra and Artistic Director of the MasterGuild Series in Oakland, as well as of our Summer Festival of Chamber Music.

**Of note in the programs this summer are: the Double Concerto for two violins and orchestra by J.S. Bach, solos by Cordula Merks, playing the Ravel sonata, and Peter Wyrick playing Beethoven's late sonata in C, Op. 102, No. 1, and the monumental Piano Quintet by the French composer César Franck.**

The Franck work is not heard very often, Bogas says, partly because of its difficulty and partly because of the demanding requirements of its dramatic content. It will be heard on the Saturday program. Sunday's program will conclude with the ever popular Piano Quintet by Robert Schumann.

Thanks to the efforts of local music lovers in our community, world-class performers have become a regular occurrence at Gualala Arts Center. Many prominent musicians travel long distances to play for Gualala audiences, providing easy access to some of the world's most amazing music.

## **Take a Trip to Asia!**

From July 10 to July 20 the Arts Center will be closed to the public from 9:30 am to 12:30 pm while visiting youth take a trip to Asia during Global Harmony Summer Adventure Camp!

This year's classes include Japanese fish painting, or Gyotaku, block printing on textiles, making books with sun prints and calligraphy, anthropology and cultural lessons, Asian cuisine, and even some Martial Arts!

New this year -- enjoy adult camp classes with your kids! (You know you've always wanted to go to summer camp!) Anthropologist Anne Menne is offering two workshops for you and your child (or inner child -- you don't have to have a child to attend!) On Tuesday, July 17, join Menne for "Making Life-Size Anime Portraits" from 6 to 8 pm in the upstairs classroom. On Wednesday, July 19, bring your family and try "Make Your Family Crest"! During camp, instructor Jessica Crouch will be leading a workshop on Gyotaku and block printing. Originally used to record and commemorate a fisherman's catch, fish prints are created with sumi ink on paper, using a real fish! Block prints will be hand-colored on cotton fabric using natural dyes and paint brushes. Jessica lives in Nashville, Tenn.

Local Martial Arts instructor Lini Lieberman will teach some beginning moves and routines in Karate and the Martial Arts and local artist Andrea Allen will teach Chinese brush painting on rice paper and ceramics. Executive Director David "Sus" Susalla will lead the Asian cooking classes.





## Georgian Children's Choir E.Mikeladze Central Music School

*"Singing Makes Perfect" – under this motto, the choir singers get the knowledge of Georgian through oral traditions and do their best to reach success.*

"Our main aim is to share our cultural treasure to foreigners and by this way make our old country more famous in the different parts of the world. Georgia isn't known in many countries. Many people do not know about its existence, about its old traditions and natural beauty by which it is usually attractive for visitors," says director Badri Jimsheleishvili, conductor and director of the Choir of E. Mikeladze Central Music School.

Robert Geary, a part-time coastal resident and Founding Artistic Director of Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir, brings this internationally acclaimed Georgian choir to Gualala Arts Center. The choir will be participating in the 11th triennial Golden Gate International Children's and Youth Choral Festival (GGF) that is hosted by the Piedmont East Bay Children's Choir.

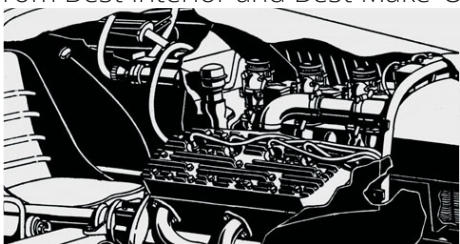
Gualala Arts Auto Show is celebrating 10 years of hot cars in the cool redwoods!

## "From the California Shores to St. Petersburg, Russia - The Story, The Project"

Join Robin Joy Wellman as she shares personal stories and insights of the six-year long project and partnership with the Museum of Anthropology, the Kunstkamera, in St. Petersburg, Russia.

The museum houses one of the largest collections of artifacts from the Fort Ross era.

Robin recently retired after 27 years at Fort Ross State Historic Park where she worked with natural and cultural history interpretation.

Across the oceans people came together to bring attention and voice to a 200-year-old collection. Robin's focus will highlight this amazing and successful collaboration with approved tribal members from Kashaya, Coast Miwok, Dry Creek Pomo, and Southern Pomo in collaboration with curators from the Kunstkamera.

Robin has presented internationally throughout Russia, Paris, and California. Her passion and dedication to the telling of the Northwest Pacific has been core to her life work.

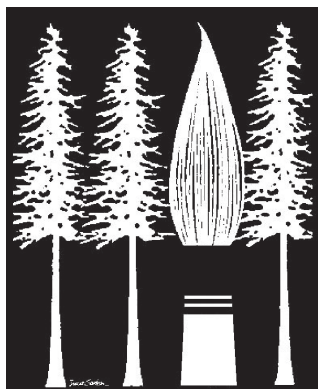
