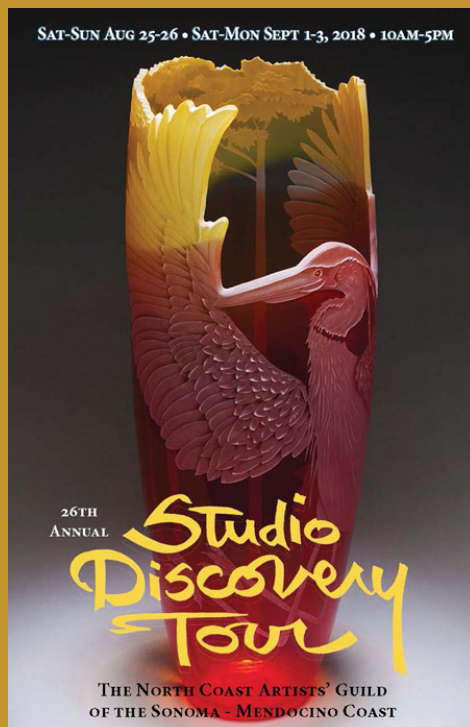

"Are you ready?!"

I get that question a lot this time of year. Are you ready for the: Car Show, Youth Camp, Studio Discovery Tour, or Art in the Redwoods?

Thanks to literally hundreds of volunteers, a handful of dedicated staff, a whole town full of awesome businesses, a community that cares about the quality of life they surround themselves with, a gang of productive artists, a team of committee leaders that never ceases to amaze me and YOU, our faithful membership, **I can enthusiastically answer . . . "Indeed! We will be!"**

With the car show, youth camp, chamber music weekend -- and throw in a international children's chorus from the country of Georgia and a local fundraiser dance party -- I'd say we have had a pretty successful July. I will not bore you with all the behind-the-scenes details but know that **a very dedicated core staff is orchestrating this symphony of volunteers & artists to support all this great programing for you.**

We are now in a full-court press towards Art in the Redwoods, a 57-year tradition. **Karel Metcalf** (a great mentor of mine and previous Executive Director of Gualala Arts) used to wear **a button labeled "Don't Panic!"** as preparations went on for Art in the Redwoods (AIR).

Cynthia Myers etched glass

This will be Cynthia Myers second two-person show at the Dolphin Gallery, again showing with artist Siobhan Elder, who also creates functional art for others to enjoy at reasonable prices.

"My work is meant to be more than a functional object such as a wine goblet, a vase or even a glass front door," says Myers. "Each is a

personal statement meant to reflect the taste of the owner and to provide artistic pleasure to the viewer. Each completed piece captures and bends the light to produce its own luminous effect."

Working for more than 25 years in this medium, Myers' creative process begins with the design of the blown glass she uses from three U.S. glassblower artisans. She first adheres resist tape to the surface of the glass and carefully draws her designs, taking into account how the pattern will reflect light. Next, she cuts out the pattern of areas that will be sand blasted or etched. With experience acquired over many years she etches in the design one detail at a time inside the studio's sandblasting booth.

Siobhan's work for this collection is called "Atmospheres." She says it grew out of her desire to capture the unique light that happens here on the north coast. "Thirty-plus years as a professional textile artist have found my work being sold worldwide on wearable items from hand painted silk neckties to scarves. This collection marries the wearable aspects of my work with the fine art background that is the base of my work as an artist. These pieces are designed to be experienced as wall hangings and/or worn as scarves and wraps."

Siobhan is passionate about her silk paintings -- which bring her joy -- as well as the people who wear her work.

"I paint because I am an artist and I am still giddy every morning when I go to my studio. I paint because I am filled with gratitude that my time is spent creating something that can make someone else feel special," she says. This passion for the work she does led to the project "Empowerment through Accessories," in which she began teaching people going through chemotherapy to paint scarves they could then wear.

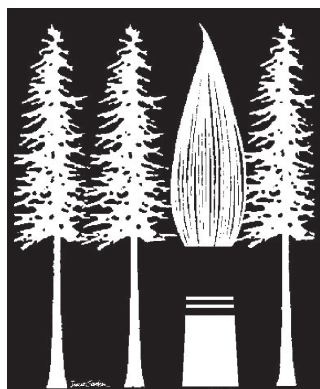

The Festival weekend begins with the Hats Off Dinner, Gualala Arts largest fundraising event of the year! This year we're going retro with a Roaring '20s theme -- dress accordingly or come as you are!

Join us for a lively night of good food, dancing and entertainment as we enjoy the company of good friends and bounty of our local coast.

Let's raise a glass (or two!) to all of the artists who participate in the festival and the wonderful judges who donate their time and energy!



Entertainment this year is provided by the husband and wife duo of Four Shillings Short.

The music of Christy Martin and Aodh Óg O'Tuama is rooted in Celtic and American folk, inspired by Indian Raga and ethnic idioms; it is a diverse and inventive traditional music experience.

Born in Cork, Ireland, Aodh Óg (pronounced, ayog) studied Medieval and Renaissance music in college. He received a music fellowship to study at Stanford University in 1984. Christy was born into a musical family. She played the sitar for 10 years, starting at the age of 16. Took up folk music in the '80's. Has been playing hammered dulcimer since 1993.



Culinary ART at its peak!

Each year the Hats Off Dinner is a divine mix of local chefs' chosen entrees and sides with the Gualala Arts Culinary Arts Guild serving up specialties of their own -- it all culminates in a menu meant to delight the palate while ensuring nobody leaves hungry!



This year, chef Sheralyn Kirby is designing her menu around a beef tenderloin roulade stuffed with cherries, spinach and goat cheese with a second offering of either salmon or steelhead. "I'm hoping for salmon! I also plan to have crab from Kaitlin fisheries for crab cakes," she says.

If you have been to any of the dinners that chef Sheralyn has prepared, you know what you're in for -- culinary art that sprinkles the tastebuds with micro-explosions of pleasure!

Side dishes will include roasted potatoes, fall vegetables, and the Stornetta brothers are donating home-grown fava beans! As always, party-goers will enjoy creative appetizers and delicacies beforehand.

Woodenhead Winery will be pouring and acclaimed Chef Rebecca Stewart of the Blackpoint Grill at The Sea Ranch Lodge will create a complementary delight!

A dessert buffet will be provided by Devon King of The Ranch Cafe.

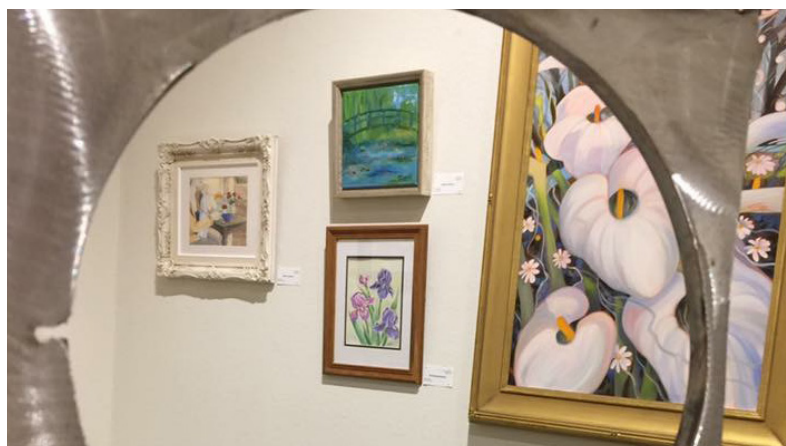

**57th Annual Art in the Redwoods
Fine Arts Exhibit**

The Art in the Redwoods Fine Arts Exhibit is at the heart of the Art in the Redwoods Festival. The Champagne Preview is the opening reception for all of the amazing artists who have entered their work and the first viewing of the show.

With more than 300 art items entered, this event continues to be one of the largest of its kind in Northern California. Artists from throughout California will enter this year's exhibit in 16 categories and \$5,000 will be awarded in cash prizes.

The Champagne Preview is also a chance to meet some of the vendors who will be sharing their wares during the festival. Judging takes place all day Friday and there is much anticipation before the doors open at 4:30 pm. Once inside, take your time perusing the many works while you enjoy a glass of champagne, served from 4 to 6 pm. At 6:15 pm in Coleman Hall, the husband and wife judging team of Bruce Mitchell and Nancy Hemmingway will give insights into how they went about picking the winners and offer an informative and interesting critique on each piece.



In 2017, Mark Chase won First Place for his revolving sculpture "Study in Motion,"

Awards include Best of Show, Best Local Work, Most Popular, Judges Awards, Redwood Coast Land Conservancy, Friends of the Gualala River, Mendonoma Sightings, Beading Excellence, Emerging Artist (best work under age 18), and **First through Third prizes in all categories:** Oil & Acrylics, etc; Water Media; Prints & Graphics; Sculpture; Monochromatic Photography; Color Photography; Digital Art; Pastels & Drawings; Woodworking; Glass; Jewelry & Ornamentation; Clay & Mosaic; Fibers, Textiles & Soft Sculpture; Quilts; Collage, Mixed Media & 2-D Assemblage; and Weaving.

Meet the Judges:

Bruce Mitchell & Nancy Hemmingway

Bruce Mitchell has been working with wood for over four decades in northern California and is widely known for his lathe-turned vessels, sculptural tables, benches and abstract forms. In addition to books and catalogs, his work can be found in numerous museums and private collections throughout the United States.

"Making art is something I absolutely have to do because it fills my life with a delight like nothing else. What makes that experience so fulfilling for me is exploring the connection between my feelings for the material and the sense of discovery that happens in the making of an object," Bruce says. "My intent as an artist is to draw upon nature, journeys into dream worlds and the unknown, and then bring life to those excursions through the language of sculpture."

Bruce's carved and lathe-turned redwood burl is on the cover of this month's Sketches.

Nancy Hemmingway was the librarian for the Inverness library for 42 years, retiring in 2014. In 1971, Hemmingway co-founded the Dance Palace, a non-profit community center providing a wide variety of educational, recreational, cultural and community services for youth and adults in western Marin County.

Hemmingway remains active in the Dance Palace which still serves as the central community facility for the small, semi-rural coastal villages of West Marin.

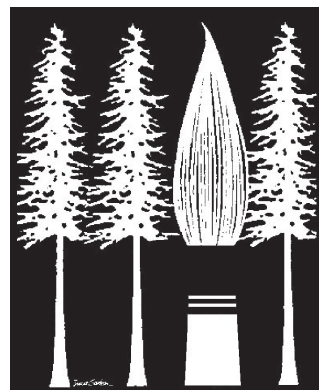

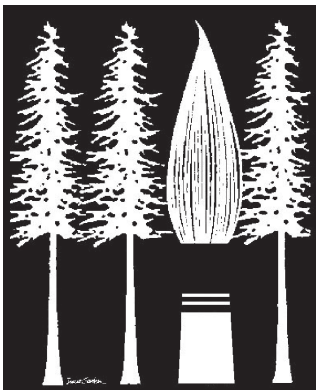

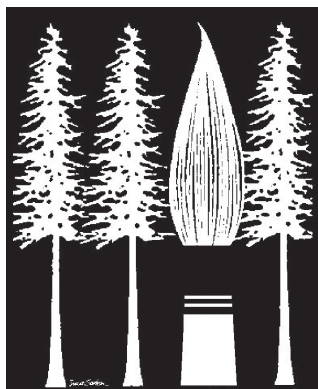

Adam Arenson

A special presentation by **historian and preservation advocate Adam Arenson** will take place Sunday morning at 10 am in Coleman Hall. Arenson authored the award-winning book **"Banking on Beauty: Millard Sheets and Midcentury Commercial Architecture in California,"** documenting the art and architecture of Millard Sheets. He will share his experience researching and writing about the extraordinary partnership of financier
