Galactic Oceanic

Former curator Peter Flagg of the Crocker Art Museum describes Paul Stein's ceramic works as a fascinating mixture of Eastern sensibilities and California flair.

The ceramic vessels of Paul Stein closely parallel the effects of ceramics from the Chinese Song and Ming dynasties with their emphasis on perfection of color and form and in the translucency of their thin bodies, Flagg says. Most of the forms of Stein's porcelain vessels recall no specific shapes in the canon of Chinese ceramics, but rather appear to be loosely based on them. Similarly, his glazes — composed of brilliant rich or understated tones — have no exact equivalent in Chinese porcelain.

"Technically, Paul Stein's work is absolutely stunning and mystifying to most porcelain artists and collectors. He is very well received by his peers and has a great reputation in the world of ceramics. For me, seeing Paul's work in person makes me 'feel' something has touched my inner soul and has a sense of timelessness like none other that I have felt, says David "Sus" Susalla, Gualala Arts Executive Director. "I have personally been looking forward to this exhibit for some time now and I hope you enjoy getting an up-close, intimate look into this very special treasure of our coast."

Paul Stein studied with Richard Shaw at the San Francisco Art and he worked with Marguerite Wildenhain at Pond Farm. He now lives and works on the Mendocino Coast in a contemporary classic style in porcelain.

Old Painted Doors & Gates

Asha Carolyn Young presents her colorful painted doors as standing sculptural pieces. The rustic wooden doors, complete with nicks and scars acquired over many years, are each unique, found objects. Some of them are over 100 years old, she says.

"Doors and gates are, to me, beautiful, mystical symbols of transition and transformation," Young says. "Standing before them, they can evoke warmth and familiarity, anticipation and curiosity, excitement and trepidation—many emotions and imaginings. Old found doors carry a mystery regarding the history they hold with people who used them. They're quite lovable."

Young started painting on old found doors in 1995 when she first moved to San Francisco and lacked the money for paper or canvases. "I found this marvelous old gate outside the studio I was sharing on Natoma Street. I knew the deep grooves in the weathered wood would take oil paint nicely. Soon I was painting on large, stately doors along with rustic gates."

"For my seventh birthday, my father gave me a set of oil paints and said, 'Just don't eat anything,' and I began squeezing tubes of luscious paint and enjoying my big brushes," she says. "I still paint, now with a variety of mediums, approaches and surfaces. Each approach offers unique experiences and outcomes. Painting on old wooden doors is sheer fun."

As a teenager, she took Chinese brush painting classes, which led to a lifetime of enjoyment of painting on a variety of surfaces with ink, acrylic, chalk pastel and oil.

Young studied art at Laney College, Cultural Anthropology at U.C. Berkeley, and took lessons with a Japanese brush painting master for about seven years. She currently focuses mostly on plein air landscape, seascape painting, mixed media abstracts -- and doors.

While classes certainly help artists to "learn the basics," Nancy Burres says that at some point an artist simply needs to keep painting, keep experimenting, until "you get it just right." Burres has been getting it just right for a long time, showing her work in galleries in Napa, Sonoma, and Mendocino counties. Her work is displayed in the Dolphin Gallery and in the Mendocino Country Store. "I love painting with oil," Burres says, adding that she also creates abstract images using acrylic: she chooses the medium that best suits her subject matter.


Burres notes that she especially "loves landscapes: when I look at a beautiful scene it gives me a sense of harmony and serenity," which she then captures in her paintings. Her many paintings of red-woods, sunsets, high mountain wildflowers, water scenes, and old falling-down cabins show her attachment to the natural world. Her ultimate goal, she says, "is to create artworks of beauty and peace that nourish the viewer on a spiritual level."

Barbara Harris jewelry

Barbara Harris describes her jewelry as "sculptural assemblages created from copper, brass, rubber, and plastic repurposed from salvage yards or found on the ground and the beach," along with whatever strikes her imagination, such as plumbing washers, poker chips, glass fishing floats, and seed pods. As this description suggests, Harris's work is inspired by what she finds around her: each piece she designs is one-of-a-kind and none are designed in advance. Rather, the materials themselves are the "initial inspiration" that leads to even more inspiration as she works her way through construction.

In addition to making remarkably memorable jewelry, Harris is an illustrator, calligrapher, graphic artist, and arts administrator who currently serves as Communications Director for the Voigt Family Sculpture Foundation in Geyserville. She also trains volunteer docents to lead tours at the famous Oliver Ranch. In addition to her work as an administrator for a number of arts organizations, Harris taught graphic design and visual communications courses at Santa Rosa Junior College for over 25 years.



If you've ever attended an event, any event, at Gualala Arts, chances are you've seen and probably met P.D. Serratoni. Maybe he greeted you at the entrance... or handed you your program. Perhaps he even showed you to your seat. The fact is, in the words of David 'Sus' Susalla, Executive Director of Gualala Arts, "P.D. volunteers for everything. I call him a 'Renaissance Man'.
