# PPQG Exhibit: "One Red Square" Opening Reception October 4

Each year, Pacific Piecemakers Quilt Guild members are "challenged" to create a quilt that fits certain parameters.

For 2019, the theme is "One Red Square". Although no specific style nor size is required, each entry must include, at the minimum, a clearly visible finished 1-inch square of one of seven primary red fabrics, including two silk fabrics, a dupioni and

a charmeuse! Inspiration can come from absolutely anywhere or anything. Members are challenged to consider applying the few simple Challenge rules and to stitch and/or quilt their own interpretation in fabric in one, two or three dimensions.



Quilts to be exhibited include traditional, modern & art quilts, clothing, and a variety of styles & techniques.

The show is not juried nor judged, so it encourages creativity at all levels. It is always a great thrill to see someone new to quilting/art quilts show their work alongside long-time quilters.

#### **About PPQG**

The members of Pacific Piecemakers Quilt Guild promote quilting locally and all along the Sonoma/Mendocino coast. PPQG offers monthly educational programs, lectures, and workshops for quilters of all skill levels as well as opportunities for members to give back to their community using those skills.

Monthly meetings feature programs to inspire quilters in all aspects of quilting ranging from traditional to contemporary art quilt techniques and development of textile and wearable art. Lectures and workshops are presented by world famous quilters as well as local talent. "Comfort quilts" are created by members and distributed to a variety of local assistance organizations and individuals as a means of service back to the community. Each year members create a quilt to be raffled by Gualala Arts Center during Art in the Redwoods. The proceeds provide art related scholarships to local students.

# Melissa McCann — "Fused Glass" Andrea Allen — "Chinese Brush Painting"

**Melissa McCann** states that "Fused glass is an ancient art form. It is also called warm glass to distinguish it from cold (stained glass) or hot (blown glass). Fused glass is heated in a kiln."

Shapes of glass are cut from high quality, handmade sheets of colored glass. The shapes are assembled into a design that is at least two layers thick. It is then fired in a kiln to about 1500 degrees to fuse it together creating a solid sheet.



The sculptural pieces (table and wall hung) have been fired numerous times to show layers or specific textures in the final form. When a piece is displayed in a stand, that stand has been commercially purchased.

"I began my artistic exploration as a potter creating wheel thrown functional ware for over twenty years. Since 2001, glass fusing has become my primary means of expression. I

love the way the light and the medium interact. The colors and brightness connect to my own discovery of spirit."

As a Chinese Brush Artist, **Andrea Allen** has developed a unique style that combines the traditions of the Chinese Masters with

a subtle, contemporary flair. She studied with a Chinese Master for six years, and has been painting and teaching in this style for over twenty years.

Andrea utilizes many ancient Chinese techniques such as grinding her own Sumi ink, often mixing it with watercolor, loading the calligraphy brush, and applying it to handmade rice paper, with a minimal number of strokes to complete each painting. She carefully balances the



unpainted and painted spaces in each composition, creating a tranquil flow throughout each painting.

Ancient Chinese symbolism and philosophy influence her work, enhancing the feeling of vital energy and serenity. The inherent effect is for the viewer to be effortlessly invited into each painting and to experience a peaceful balance and harmony in a timeless continuum.

# The Manhattan Piano Trio Opening the Chamber Music Season Sunday, October 13, 2019

Hailed by critics as "a grand departure from the usual", the Manhattan Piano Trio, now in its 15th season, is one of the most creative, exciting, and dynamic young ensembles in America. The Washington Post described the trio as "impressive" and "outstanding", while the Sarasota Herald Tribune said "one seldom is privileged to enjoy music of such a wide range of styles performed with self-effacing skill and relaxed assurance."

For this performance, veteran member and pianist Milana Strezeva joins forces with colleagues Solomiya Ivakhiv, violin, and Sophie Shao, cello, to thrill our audience with another brilliant performance.

Milana Strezeva is a Moldovan-A merican pianist, praised by the Boston Globe for her "technically fluid, dramatically



convincing, and sonically full-bodied supportive collaborations". At the age of 11 she began playing chamber music with her clarinetist father and her mother, a renowned soprano. Her love for family collaboration eventually grew into a passionate advocacy of vocal and instrumental chamber music.

Violinist Solomiya Ivakhiv has quickly earned a reputation for performing with "distinctive charm and subtle profundity" (Daily Freeman, New York) and a "crystal clear and noble sound" (Culture and Life, Ukraine). Known for her work as a soloist and chamber musician, Ivakhiv has performed at Carnegie Hall, San Jose Chamber Music Society, Old First Concerts in San Francisco, and at UConn's Jorgensen Center for the Performing Arts.

Cellist Sophie Shao, winner of the prestigious Avery Fisher Career Grant and top prizes at the Rostropovich and Tchaikovsky competitions, is a versatile and passionate artist whose performances the New York Times has noted as "eloquent, powerful" and the Washington Post called "deeply satisfying." Shao has received critical acclaim throughout the United States. She is on the faculty of Vassar College and the Bard Conservatory of Music and plays on a cello made by Honore Derazey from 1855, once owned by Pablo Casals.

# Gualala Arts' Chamber Music Series Returns October 13 Season Tickets Now Available

The six-performance regular season begins October 13 and includes both artists new to our stage as well as the return of several all-time favorite ensembles. All performances are Sunday afternoons at 4 pm. Season tickets for all six concerts are available now for \$125. Individual tickets are \$25 for each concert. Award-winning Russian violinist **Nikita Borisevich and pianist Margarita Loukachkina** perform **November 10**. Borisevich is known for the depth and sensitivity in his playing and utterly finessed

technique. Loukachkina's style represents the best traditions of the Russian Piano School—flawless technique, impeccable sense of style and beautiful tone.

**Eric Kritz and Friends** take the stage **January 19**. Kritz is an outstanding clarinetist. Joining him are Carolyn Steinbuck, piano, Marcia Lotter,

violin, Tammie Dyer, violin, Jeff Ives, viola, and Marcia Sloane, cello. Their concert will feature works by Mozart, Bernstein, Milhaud, and more.

On **February 16**, **Boris Andrianov and Dimitri Illarionov** offer the uncommon yet wonderful pairing of cello and guitar. Andrianov is considered one of the most gifted Russian cellists of his generation and Illarionov one of the most important classical guitarists emerging from Russia's younger generation of musicians.

The **Escher String Quartet** (**March 8**) has received acclaim for its expressive, nuanced performances that combine unusual textural clarity with a rich, blended sound. The ensemble serves as Season Artists of The Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center. Members are Adam Barnett-Hart, violin, Brenden Speltz, violin, Pierre Lapointe, viola, and Brook Speltz, cello.



The season's final concert **April 19** features 17-year old **violinist Alex Zhou**, the 2018 Gold Medalist, Klein International String Competition. Alex Zhou studies under the tutelage of Zhao Wei at the San Francisco Conservatory of Music. He has won numerous awards and has performed with several orchestras including the California Youth Symphony.

# 7th Annual Gualala Salon and Salon des Refusés

The 7th annual Gualala Salon & Salon des Refusés is a juried and judged fine art exhibit showcasing outstanding visual art and artists without regard to the type of media.

The annual Salon & Salon des Refusés is the largest exhibit at Gualala Arts aside from Art in the Redwoods; it has the greatest number of

entries of any other open call show and fills both the Burnett Gallery and Elaine Jacob Foyer. Many artists save their best new art for this exhibit.

As per tradition, the judges decide what artwork is accepted into the Salon and then exhibited in the Burnett Gallery. The art not juried into the Salon by the judges



is displayed in the Salon des Refusés (Rejected) located in the Elaine Jacob Foyer. Thus, all artwork submitted into the show will be exhibited at Gualala Arts.



This year's monetary awards are first prize of \$1000, second prize of \$750, and third prize of \$500. The People's Choice awards in the Salon des Refusés are first prize of \$100, second \$75 and third \$50. The award for Emerging Artist Under 18 years of age is \$100.

In the spirit of the original Paris Salon des Refusés, all visitors will be able to vote for the "People's Choice" awards. In fact, many artists prefer to be selected as a "reject" to receive the public's opinion!
