

I always love February. It is a time to celebrate our volunteers, board of directors, artists and, of course, our donors & sponsors.


It really is a special community that we have all created together. Not only do we have our passion for creation, we set a platform for discussion, sharing and opening up our senses to experience.

"Personal Perceptions" An Exhibit Curated by Ron Bolander

Are you serious about your art?
Are you creative, honest with yourself and tired of meaningless "Souvenir Shop Art"?

These are the questions posed by Exhibit Curator Ron Bolander as he invited area artists to become part of a new exhibit at Gualala Arts. "Personal Perceptions" will exhibit that art during February, with an opening reception set for Friday, February 7, from 5 pm to 7 pm.

Artists were asked to convey with their art, a personal, truthful answer to either one or both of these questions:

- "How do you perceive your immediate social environment?"
- "How are you perceived by your immediate social environment?"

DaVinci, Lautrec, Picasso, Dali, Magritte and many more serious artists have successfully created visual answers to these two questions. **Can You?**

Most of us, if not everyone, know people that are more familiar to us. This is the group with whom you interact on a more frequent and personal basis. Whether you run into them at the local coffee shop or restaurant or you see them at events or other social functions, have you ever thought "How do THEY perceive me?" "How do YOU perceive them?"



For this exhibit, artists were encouraged to use all forms of media, 2-D and 3-D (except video). The work submitted should be no more than 3 years old and may not have been exhibited at Gualala Arts or the Dolphin at any time in the past. This show is not juried nor judged, so it encouraged creativity at all levels.

"Water's Edge" New Work from Nicole Paisley Martensen

"Water's Edge" is an installation reflecting concerns about the planet, both intimate and global. Paintings around the circumference of the foyer depict abstract aerial views of Arctic ice melt. Silk panels hanging in the center of the space reflect images of our ecosystem on the Mendocino Coast and invite a conversation on how rising sea levels and the effects of climate change will challenge all of us to redefine our sense of "home." In its solid ice-state, in its sea-level



rise, in its life-giving force, and its propagating abilities, water offers its potential for self-reflection and invokes a deep reverence, reminding us that we are all edgedwellers.

"My paintings include many layers of collaged materials bound together in encaustic medium: fragments of domestic textiles, pages of old books, navigational

charts, discarded detritus from our everyday lives. This ongoing dialogue with the material brings its own history which is woven into the work. My silk panels incorporate several transfer processes and cyanotypes of local seaweed, sewn together with vintage fragments."

Nicole Paisley Martensen finds the vibrant and rugged Mendocino coastline is a constant source of inspiration, both in and out of the water. "I'm a surfer, and there is an inherent correlation between the uncertainty, thrill, and vulnerability of surfing and the creative process for me. You can see more of my art at nicolepaisley.com."

The "Water's Edge" exhibit has been extended and will remain on display thru Sunday, March 1, 2020.

"Fabric and Wood: Beyond Patterns" Featuring The Works of Bette Covington and James Docker

"Fabric and Wood" features the quilts of Bette Covington and the wood laminate projects of James Docker. Both Covington and Docker bring clear examples of the connection between form and function in their work: art appreciation with practical application.

Born in California, and educated at both Stanford and UCLA, Bette Covington—like many coastal residents—migrated from the Bay area. She relocated to the Mendonoma coast in 2003. She also changed her focus from 30 years of teaching and performing piano to exploring a new form of artistic expression. Covington discovered that working with fabric brought an exciting new kind of freedom of expression. "My work involves an appreciation of fabricant and a spontaneous approach to design. I allow the fabric to direct my work one piece or shape leading me to the next, evolving as I work. I love the results and often use part of one design to influence the next. The results are abstract and evocative."

James Docker studied at Pepperdine and earned an MFA from San Francisco State University. He lived and studied

language, culture, arts and architecture in Kyoto, Japan from the late 1960's into the early '70s. During his 50-year career as a licensed General Contractor, Docker designed and constructed custom homes on The Sea Ranch, in the Napa Valley and throughout the greater Bay Area.



In the winter of 2016 Docker began with the design and fabrication of knife blocks and boards for neighbors, friends and family. He continues to do home design, but now focuses his creative efforts on knife block and serving board creation and fabrication. "Quilting in wood."

Andrianov & Illarionov Chamber Music Performance

Andrianov & Illarionov



Chamber Music lovers will appreciate the uncommon pairing of cello and guitar. In reality, it is a happy one for both the artists and the audience. Andrianov & Illarionov come to Coleman Hall at Gualala Arts Sunday, February 16, at 4 pm. There will be a pre-concert talk beginning at 3:45pm.

Boris Andrianov is considered one of the most gifted Russian cellists

of his generation. A Berlin critic pinpointed the special quality of his playing by commenting "Andrianov plays like a god, with heart-breaking beautiful softly vibrating bel canto tone and masterly noblesse, always pointing toward the inner core even in virtuoso passages."

Dimitri Illarionov, one of the most important classical guitarists to emerge from Russia's younger generation of musicians, can also boast of many international awards and prizes. He leads an active concert life playing solo recitals and appearing with chamber ensembles and symphony orchestras in Russia, Western Europe, the USA, Canada, and Mexico. Important presenters say of Illarionov: "A revelation; among the very top concerts in 27 years; one of the top guitarists of today."

Their skills have been lauded as audiences and critics alike have had the opportunity to witness their artistry in concert halls and competitions around the world. The innate songfulness of the cello adapts nicely in partnership with the plucked precision of the guitar.




