EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR'S MESSAGE

Pandemic Policy?!

I am writing to you directly instead of mailing a copy of our April Sketches (trying to save money and with all events canceled!) Obviously these are unprecedented times, and we all have to make decisions on a daily basis with the information we have.

I was asked by a couple of people, "what is your policy for this pandemic?" After opening our big book of policy and thumbing through it...it became very apparent there is no policy for our current situation. So, I thought about it and wrote one. Full disclosure...I have not yet vetted it through our policy committee and board. It is very simple, and I hope that you will decide to adopt this policy as well.

Our Pandemic Policy is, "Be Kind!"

With this new policy firmly in thought, we shall "Be kind" to our artists postponing their exhibits and extending deadlines, to exploring alternative venues such as virtual galleries, to our ticket holders and offering full refunds, to our staff by having them work from home - keeping them employed as long as feasible, to our committees by having remote meetings using the latest technologies, to our rental clients by working with them to reschedule, to our donors by being frugal with their much needed donations, to our members by reaching out to them such as writing this letter, to our traveling musicians and rescheduling their performances when it makes sense...well, you get the gist...

But most of all we need to be kind to ourselves so we may be of service to others in the current challenge that has come to ALL of us.

I wish I had more answers as to when we will re-open the center, when we will get our exhibits back up (including the Dolphin Gallery), when can we gather around the pizza oven and share that awesome pizza dough recipe, when will we be able to host one of the longest running art festivals in California: Art in the Redwoods. The obvious answer is "We don't know yet."

Following is an update of our current situation as of today, March 22, 2020.

We have closed our doors to the public until April 7 (at the very earliest and perhaps into the summer) to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19 as mandated by our county and state. We have cancelled dozens of our events, workshops, fundraisers & exhibits through the April, May & beyond.

Some of the things that we are doing currently to further our mission to promote the arts include:

- Hosting some of our workshops as Webinars, exploring virtual exhibits and other tech savvy experiences so that folks can continue to develop their skillsets and explore new media from the safety of home.
- Posting our current Arts in the School exhibit to our social media sites in a virtual gallery setting so the families and young artists can experience their work. Our goal is to have every young artist entry online (over 500 works!) by the end of March.
- Proposing a new exhibit entitled Shelter from the Storm: Art in the Time of Covid-19. We encourage artists & non-artists alike to create art while sheltering in their homes. We are looking forward to seeing what everyone has been working on to keep themselves busy while sheltering in their homes.
- We are in final phases of our yearlong maintenance projects to maintain & preserve our building. We have engaged Trent Kreck to power wash, seal & stain the exterior of Gualala Arts. This is one of the last phases of exterior maintenance. Two phases, which were recently completed included termite & beetle removal and the installation of a new roof. All of these projects are expected to protect our building for many years to come.
- As most of you know, we have lost our location at the Sundstrom Mall. **Thankfully, we have located a prime location in Uptown Gualala which should prove be very successful for the Gualala Arts Gallery & Dolphin Gift Shop.** Of course, this will require funds for the relocation, signage and store set-up.
- As always, our Sketches newsletter is available online, but we will not be mailing Sketches in April and possibly May and into the future as warranted to save resources.

These are uncertain time for all of us to say the least. **The board and finance committees are making prudent decisions with our Gualala Arts assets.** If you find that you are in a position to help with the loss of our revenue stream, it would be greatly appreciated. We are looking to continue our mission - to promote public interest & participation in the arts since 1961 – well into the future.

WE make a difference with our choices.

Animalia Musicale: A Chorus of Critters The Art of Leslie Lakes

ANIMALIA MUSICALE: A CHORUS OF CRITTERS features images of both wild and domestic animals—from fish to fox, bees to bunnies, dogs to cats, giraffes to frogs, seals to skunks, cheetahs and frogs and bears (and so much more)...oh my!

What makes the images of unique interest is that most are painted on musical score sheets. With the artist's love for animals



of all kinds, the images are meant to tickle the senses and to engage the viewer with a sense of play, joy, humor and a touch of whimsy (sans the kitsch).

Art is and has been Leslie's passion ever since she was a little girl. Her earliest memories of creating "art"

was her favorite playtime activity by placing pennies in various formations on the floor. Raised in an artistic Bohemian household in Greenwich Village, NYC, Leslie attended the Greenwich House School of Pottery and Painting (Jones Street), as well as the Greenwich House School of Music (Barrow Street). In 1967, Leslie's family relocated to Paris, France where she schooled at the Lycee International in St. Germain-en-Laye, before returning to the States to continue her education.

Currently a resident of Mill Valley, CA, Leslie is best described by many as a true "Renaissance woman" and entrepreneur. Aside from a diversified business background, Leslie is a professional artist, art curator, established writer, former singer/songwriter/performer for children; massage therapist for the past 30 years+. Leslie enjoys being vitally active in community affairs and various fund-raising events.

Leslie's style of award-winning artwork is at once lively, witty, whimsical, quirky, gestural, free and fluid in nature. Her work combines her love of anything nostalgic (i.e., antique sheet music, vintage fashion ads, etc.), nature, animals, music, dance and poetry themes. Her wish is that it makes you smile.

The Camp Fire through Art The Art of Brian Holderman

"A life once led by emotional turmoil wrought by the Camp Fire has now been healed through art's power to visually share a story of hope."

Inferno: One Man's Journey of

Brian Holderman's experience of being trapped for eight-hours in the blaze that devastated Paradise California comes to life through 10 paintings, 20 photographs, and five video clips. On that day, he was at work in Chico, but decided to return to Paradise to rescue his two dogs—one that was a service dog at the school where he was the principal. "I knew the students would be



devastated if anything happened to Bear the service dog. What I didn't realize is the emotional affect the experience would have on me."

After finishing out the school year, Brian was placed on oneyear medical leave. Purely by happenstance, he traveled to Gualala one weekend in April 2019. "This was the first time I felt I could truly breathe without the memories of the Camp Fire. This was such a healing place. During that weekend, I made the decision to move to the area. I lost everything in the Camp Fire and what better place to start over."

After his move, he found a creative outlet for the trauma through painting. The paintings allowed him to release the pain he was holding. The final painting in the series is titled, Hope. This painting depicts vegetation peeking its way through the devastation. "It is a show about what happened to me on that day but ending with hope that things will rejuvenate and come back. That is what I want people to

walk away with. Even though it was a very devastating time and there was a lot of destruction that happened, we can take that pain and do something creative and positive instead of turning our efforts into something that won't help us grow from the experience. We can't change what happened, but we can make a decision about how we'll react to it."

"Our Lighthouse" An open call exhibit in honor of the Point Arena Lighthouse 150th Anniversary Celebration

The Point Arena Light Station #496 was established on September 30, 1869 and the original tower was first lit on May 1, 1870. 2020 represents the 150th anniversary of the Point Arena Lighthouse lighting the way on the coast. This exhibit is intended to celebrate this significant sesquicentennial of a Mendocino coast icon. The exhibit is open to all types of visual media, i.e. painting, photography, sculpture, fabric arts, ceramics, mixed media, jewelry, woodworking, etc. It will be an exhibit inspired by the Lighthouse and the coast that it protects and represents.

Artists are encouraged to submit artwork that is inspired by, captures the beauty and grandeur and celebrates the significance of the Point Arena Lighthouse. How the artist interprets this into their artform will be significant to and enhance the "Our Lighthouse" exhibit.

This will be a judged exhibit with awards given for first, second and third place for general entries. Artwork submitted by artists under age 18 will also be judged for first, second and third place awards:

First Place (In Memory of Luciano Zamboni) – \$500 Second Place – \$300 Third Place – (Sponsors: Kitty Wolfe & Mark Simpkins)– \$150 Young Artist First Place – \$100 Young Artist Second Place – \$50 Young Artist Third Place – \$25 Judge's Awards – Recognition Ribbon People's Choice Award (Sponsored by Carolyn André) – \$100 Director's Award (Sponsored by Carolyn André) – \$100

All winners will also receive a Point Arena Lighthouse 150th Anniversary cloisonné pin. The Point Arena Lighthouse Keepers, Inc. (PALKI), the non-profit that owns, operates and maintains the historic 150 year old Light Station, is grateful to the donors that are making the cash awards possible.

A Unique Concert At Gualala Arts Featuring Riley Lee, Maikaze Taiko, Karl Young

Roots & Rhythm

A unique concert, "Roots and Rhythm" is set for Saturday, May 2, 2020, 7 pm at Gualala Arts' Coleman Hall. The music event will feature the talents of Riley Lee, Maikaze Taiko and Karl Young. Advance tickets are \$30, \$5 for tickets purchased the day of the event. Tickets are available online at BrownPaperTickets, and at Gualala Arts.



Riley Lee began playing the shakuhachi (bamboo flute) in Japan in 1971, studying with Chikuho Sakai until 1980. He has been a student of Katsuya Yokoyama since 1984, and was given the rank of Dai Shihan (grand master) in 1980. In 1973, Riley became the first non-Japanese to play taiko (Japanese festival drums) professionally, by touring internationally as a full-time performer of taiko, yokobue (a high pitched bamboo transverse flute) and shakuhachi with Ondekoza (now called Kodo) a troupe of traditional Japanese musicians, performing with the Boston Symphony Orchestra, and at

venues such as the Kennedy Center, London's Roundhouse Theatre, Espace Pierre Cardin in Paris, and Boston's Symphony Hall.



Maikaze Taiko is a San Francisco-based performance ensemble and taiko school. The name—Dancing Wind—reflects the group's focus on innovative arrangements, precision taiko playing and creative use of movement and space. Their mission is to preserve and promote the rich cultural and artistic heritage of Japanese

Taiko drumming through performances of traditional and neo-traditional pieces that are rooted in Japanese culture. They give voice to American Taiko in the 21st century with presentations of original works that incorporate elements of world music, contemporary choreography, and interdisciplinary imagination. The group has been honored to perform at such events such as the 2018 International Taiko Festival, the San Francisco Chinese New Year's Parade and the San Francisco World Percussion Arts Festival.
