Chamber Music Concert The Escher String Quartet



The Escher String Quartet has received acclaim for its expressive, nuanced performances that combine unusual textural clarity with a rich, blended sound. In its home town of New York, the ensemble serves as Season Artists of the Chamber Music Society of Lincoln Center. The quartet includes Adam Barnett-Hart, violin; Brendan Speltz, violin; Pierre Lapointe, viola; Brook Speltz, cello.

Within months of its inception in 2005, the ensemble came to the attention of key musical figures worldwide. Championed by the Emerson Quartet, the Escher String Quartet was invited by both Pinchas Zukerman and Itzhak Perlman to be the Quartet in Residence at each artist's summer festival.

Currently the String Quartet in Residence at Southern Methodist University in Dallas, Texas and Tuesday Musical in Akron, Ohio, the quartet fervently supports the education of young musicians and has given master classes at institutions such as the Royal Academy of Music in London and Campos do Jordão Music Festival in Brazil.

The Escher String Quartet takes its name from Dutch graphic artist M.C. Escher, inspired by Escher's method of interplay between individual components working together to form a whole. its Coconut Chowder (Best in Open Class) and The Vue Kitchen for its Traditional Chowder. We expect both will want to compete to keep their titles.

As per previous years, two categories will be judged: Traditional New England-style Clam Chowder and Open Class. Challenge attendees will vote for People's Choice and Most Tasted awards. The Open Class includes but is not limited to Manhattan-style clam, crab,

shrimp, scallop, lobster, abalone, salmon, or any other seafood combination. Vegetarian chowders such as corn or mushroom are also eligible.

This year, all children from 1st through 8th grade are invited to join us for Global Harmony Summer Adventure Camp. Summer is getting closer every day so it's a good time to register your children for this special two-week adventure. This year's summer camp runs Tuesday, July 7 through Friday, July 17, 9:30 am to 12:30 pm. Both weeks are Tuesday through Friday.

Registration forms, medical consents, and all other information can be found online at GualalaArts.org under the Global Harmony tab. Especially important, if you have a teen interested in being a camp assistant, we like to have the information early for our planning purposes! Assistant applications are also available online.

Camp registration is \$195 per child by May 31, 2020; Late registration \$295 after May 31, 2020. TUITION FEES ARE FOR BOTH WEEKS. NO DISCOUNTS FOR ONE-WEEK ATTENDANCE. \$50 or \$100 scholarships are available with a written request submitted with an application.

The Beat Goes On - with David Rogers: Join the drum circle and explore the unique experience of "in the moment" music making on exotic drums and percussion. You will breathe new life into something discarded and make it beat again as we create an upcycled drum together.

Movin' on Up - with Serra King: Using upcycled materials we will create ribbons and creatively incorporate these into rhythmic dance routines. The class will culminating in a performance to share with our Global Harmony Camp community.

Transforming Treasures- with Gray Franke: Campers will learn how to create new jewelry with found objects. Using wire work, spinning, knotting and weaving you will create treasures that reflect you individual style and inspiration.

"Found": Upcycling the Self-Portrait - with Wesley Luster: Working the self portraiture—from planning the portrait, initial sketches, the palette of the skin—including some color theory—through the breaking from the mold . . . and following the project through to completion.

The Art of Upcycling - with Ann Turgeon: Campers will take items from everyday life and re-purpose them into ART - from newspaper self portraits to junk art to mosaics!

Gualala Arts is currently taking ideas for our 2021 exhibition galleries. Proposals must be received by **April 1, 2020** and artists will be notified by **April 30, 2020** for exhibits in the following calendar year: 2021. You do not have to be an artist to propose an exhibit or idea and you do not necessarily have to curate the exhibit. We are looking for new and exciting ideas from existing and up-and-coming artists!

We accept and encourage non-solicited proposals for exhibitions. If you are interested in exhibiting your work or curating a show at the Gualala Arts Center and Dolphin Gallery, you will find most of the information you will need to develop your proposal online. Please feel free to contact us at 707-884-1138 or email us at info@gualalaarts.org if you have any questions after reviewing these materials.

We have two main spaces for exhibits at the Gualala Arts Center: the Burnett Gallery and the Jacob Foyer. **In addition, Gualala Arts has presented exhibits at the Dolphin Gallery, our members' gallery in downtown Gualala** which we hope will be a reality in a new location in 2021. Gualala Arts occasionally has exhibits in Coleman Hall, our performing arts theater.

The Burnett Gallery is perfect for exhibiting work with controlled lighting needs. The off-white walls and new hardwood flooring allow the art pieces to take center stage. The gallery is a separate space with no through-traffic which allows exhibit options not available in the foyer. The open ceiling design provides additional creative exhibition space while still maintaining an intimate art experience.

The Elaine Jacob Foyer is lit primarily with natural lighting from the large front windows. Its two-story wall heights are conducive for showing large wall pieces and the beautiful slate floor and wood paneled staircase create a warm, friendly atmosphere. In addition to the walls, sculpture is often exhibited in this space, while being sensitive to not impeding the traffic flow through this area.

The Exhibit Committee welcomes new concepts and proposals. We suggest you read the documents online to help you understand how to write your proposal, know what you will be responsible for as a curator, and how and when the Exhibition Committee functions.

The SIMSC Architectural Tour is a self-guided tour of new, newly remodeled, and historically significant homes on the northern Sonoma and southern Mendocino Coast at The Sea Ranch, and homes in Anchor Bay.

The Saturday Wine Auction is an event where locals, visitors and area wineries can all participate by contributing wine for the Auction. On this Mother's Day weekend, the Arts Center becomes a wine celebration and fundraiser for Gualala Arts. Wineries can help out by donating delicious, interesting, sometimes rare, occasionally unusual and always wonderful wine in individual bottles, multi-packs or cases. Individuals can donate wine from their personal cellars. One donor has already donated a three-bottle lot (shown here). For music lovers who love wine it includes a bottle of Steely Dan Cabernet Sauvignon, a bottle of Debbie Harry Chardonnay, and a bottle of Kiss Malbec. And like all of the donated wine, it will benefit Gualala Arts.



The Gualala Arts wine tasting and auction is the premier wine event on the Sonoma Mendocino coast, featuring award winning wineries pouring a wide selection of their premium wines. Over 100 wine related auction lots will be available for silent bidding both days of the event; also featured will be premium auction lots such as bottles of award-winning wines, wine related gifts, luxurious lodging packages, golf packages, winery tours, and other great items The Wine Tasting & Auction is hosted at the Gualala Arts Center, an architectural gem nestled in the redwoods with a dramatic auditorium and foyer.

The Korbel Champagne Preview, Friday before the auction, is an elegant evening of wine tasting and an opportunity to place early bids on wine lots and check out all of the raffle prizes and art exhibits.
