

GUALALA ARTS CENTER| SPECIAL ANNOUNCEMENT

The following is an update of our current situation as of today, June 30, 2020. The Arts Center doors are still closed to the public until Aug 14 to help mitigate the spread of COVID-19. We have cancelled dozens of our events, workshops, fundraisers & exhibits starting March 16 through the summer and, already, some events in December. We hope to open for retail sales at Art in the Redwoods!

Some of the things that we ARE currently planning and doing to further our mission to promote the arts include:

- We continue using our creativity to re-imagine our future to "to promote public interest and participation in the arts."
- Thankfully, we have MOVED INTO a prime location in Cypress Village with some very generous landlords Richard & Kristine Thomure. We have spent the last month on a remodeling plan of the space to meet our needs with current COVID regulations for a safe environment for our volunteers, artists and customers. WE LOVE OUR NEW DOLPHIN HOME! We have invited about 40 artists to help open the new space on July 4.
- We are opening with caution. Staff and Volunteers are being trained on our Covid Plan, temperatures are being checked before start of shift, sanitation of touched surfaces before, during and after shift, masks required for all, physical distancing enforced, limited number of clients in store, proper signage hung, no public restrooms, sneeze guard for register, , gloves for patrons that want to touch items, touch less credit card terminal installed, lots of free flowing Pacific Ocean air through space, plenty of room to wait outside on terraces, only one way doors (in-out) and lots of great art to inspire and delight you!
- Art in the Redwoods HAS been re-imagined! Our AIR committee is working hard to bring an online version of our 59th annual Art in the Redwoods to a device near you. At the center of the event will be our members' visual art exhibit with 15 categories including a new "video clips—one minute or less" category. Sponsors will be secured. WE WILL CONTINUE TO AWARD \$5K in cash awards to winning artists thanks to our generous sponsors! GREAT NEWS! We are proofing the online exhibit entry, judging and viewing experience. We will also feature the performing arts offered by our community with new videos and "classic" performances from previous Art in the Redwoods. Culinary offerings will be a curbside "Boxed Hat" fundraiser dinner, complete with optional zoom tables, entertainment, and the first right to purchase art as usual, and lovingly homemade pies & pizza for curbside pick up throughout the weekend from your favorite sweetshop and FOPO bakers. If allowed by the county and state regulations, the in-person exhibit will be open for retail shopping and limited public viewings August 14 through August 30 at the Gualala Arts Center.
- We received 2 government loans and grants to assist with some of our payroll costs this spring. BUT those funds have run out and we are now hoping our Art in the Redwoods' fundraising efforts will carry us through the summer by our generous sponsors and membership.
- THANK YOU! Your membership renewals and donations continue making a difference. It helps to keep our staff employed, bills paid, organization strong, and planning and adapting to our future possibilities. Each dollar raised makes a difference! Thank You, Thank You, Thank You!!!!
- We continue to host a virtual exhibit titled, <u>"Inferno: One Man's Journey of the Camp Fire Through Art" by Artist Brian Holderman.</u> Works of Arts are for sale through our office by emailing Kendra <u>info@gualalaarts.org.</u>
- Planning a new exhibit entitled Shelter from the Storm: Art in the Time of Covid-19. We encourage artists & non-artists alike to create art while sheltering in their homes. We are looking forward to seeing what everyone has been working on to keep himself or herself busy while sheltering in their homes. Artists are posting using the hash tags #shelterfromthestormart & #gualalaarts
- As always, our Sketches newsletter is available online; we hope to mail out an Art in the Redwoods August edition of Sketches.

These are uncertain time for all of us to say the least. The board and finance committees are making prudent decisions with our Gualala Arts assets. **If you find that you are in a position to help with the loss of our revenue stream, it would be greatly appreciated.** We are looking to continue our mission – to promote public interest & participation in the arts since 1961 – well into the future.

The Dolphin Gallery and Gift Shop. A New Home to Welcome Artists and Art-Lovers Alike

The new Dolphin Gallery and Gift Shop opened July 4. The opening coincided with a new exhibit of jewelry by Ling-Yen Jones and the painting and prints of Barbara Kelley. The new location is at 39114 Ocean Drive, in Cypress Village, Gualala. Hours for the July 4 opening will be 11 am to 7 pm. Normal business hours will be Thursday through Monday, 11 am to 4 pm (closed Tuesday and Wednesday).

The Dolphin has been a welcomed option for art lovers and gift shoppers for decades. In its original location—at the Anchor Bay Hardware Store—shoppers could find the works of local artists in an area of the store dubbed "Gualala Arts Showroom". With art, including wood carvings of dolphins, the name was changed to **The Dolphin**,



a name which has remained unchanged for 50 years.

The Dolphin moved from Anchor Bay to Sundstrom Mall in Gualala in the 1970s where it established itself as a much loved retail store featuring gifts, jewelry, ceramics, and wood carvings. It also became (and continues to be) a hosting spot for new art exhibits. It's 40-year presence in downtown Gualala will continue, albeit in a new location, scheduled for opening July 4 at 11 am.

Supporting the Dolphin over the years has been a long list of volunteers who have donated their time, talent, energy and creativity. The warm reception visitors—locals and travelers alike—have received over the years has given the Dolphin a deserved reputation as a welcoming spot on Mendocino County's south coast.



The new Dolphin Gallery and Gift Shop will bring much of the same to its new location and the new space will provide the opportunity to re-imagine its mission. And the July 4th weekend will provide

visitors with a wonderful opening exhibit, including the jewelry of Ling-Yen Jones and the paintings and prints of Barbara Kelley. (See a separate story on Jones/Kelley on page 6.) A full story on the NEW Dolphin will appear in the August Sketches.

"Come Fly With Me"

A New Exhibit with

Ling-Yen Jones and Barbara Kelley

The new Dolphin Gallery and Gift Shop in Cypress Village opened on Saturday, July 4 with a new exhibit featuring the jewelry of Ling -Yen Jones and the paintings and prints of Barbara Kelley. Now in a larger space the new Dolphin welcomes the community to explore the new space and see this exciting new exhibit Thursday through Monday from 11 am to 4 pm.

According to Ling-Yen Jones, "Come Fly With Me" is a journey. "I thought it was about learning more about my work with some of my favorite birds—the crane and swallow. However, it is also about

learning how to transition from being at home 'sheltering in place' to exhibiting, showing, and sharing my work." Barbara Kelley's work is known to many on the coast who've discovered her prints and paintings at area galleries, or by visiting her studio in Sonoma County or at her home during the annual North Coast Artists Guild studio tour.



Talking about her pieces, Kelley says, "the central intention of my work is to create visual reflections of universal themes. I strive to create a visual language that is both

evocative and straightforward. The title I give to each work holds a key to understanding its story." She may employ found objects such as leaves, sea weeds, bird feathers, even snake skins in her prints. Kelley also creates encaustic paintings, employing a hot wax technique that dates to ancient Egypt and is difficult to master.

Ling-Yen Jones shares her personal vision of jewelry as not just ornamentation, but also as an artistic statement and symbolic representation of both the personal and the universal experience we all share. Each hand-crafted piece is a one-of-a-kind creation, even when it is part of a series with repeated motifs. She wants her work to represent various themes such as new beginnings, changes, hope and personal growth. Jones lives up to that ideal, working with sterling silver, copper, gold, pearls and colored stones. The effect of the jewelry when worn is subtle and dramatic at the same time.

The New Dolphin Gallery and Gift Shop Welcomes Scott Chieffo & Joann Cassady for a New Exhibit August 1 through August 30, 2020

The August exhibit at the Dolphin Gallery and Gift Shop will pair photographer Scott Chieffo with ceramic artist Joann Cassady. The exhibit opens Saturday, August 1.

In the 15 years that he has been living on the Southern Mendocino County Coast, Scott Chieffo has developed an intimate photographic relationship with its unique landscape. His images capture the subtle beauty of the coast and forests with a highly unique, "painterly" style that emphasizes the quiet solitude of these landscapes. Chieffo's main photographic goal is to be able to communicate this unique



viewpoint to others, such that they are able to look upon his images and develop a new and



stronger appreciation for life's details. He believes that a fine art photographic image is most powerful if it can be viewed with increasing pleasure repeatedly for many years, beyond a strong initial impact.

Joann Cassady is an artist who sees her life as having gone full circle. After art school and a career in commercial graphics, she left the industry to follow her heart back to early childhood, playing in the backyard, squishing mud pies through her fingers. This time around, clay has replaced the mud "but the pleasure I get from holding the

earth in my hands is just the same." Her pieces are all made by hand using coiling & pinching techniques and fired using different firing processes. "I don't use molds and there are no short cuts. The clay and the process can be unforgiving, even humbling at times, and not all pieces reach the intended end. But when they do, the magic in that moment is the inspiration that drives the process and fuels my passion to do it again."


