This concert was enjoyed in person by Sus documenting for social, Allen documenting on video, the ravens, our redwoods trees, critters in the woods, enjoyed live by many on Facebook, Instagram and our local radio station live KTDE 100.5 fm and will live on in perpetuity on the internet social sites. - Thanks to our new friends and partners, MCRPD, Mendocino Coast Recs and Parks District we hosted a safe "Halloween Trick or Treat Drive Through." We combined this event with our inaugural pumpkin carving contest and it turned out to be a smashing success! (Literally in some cases ©)
- Thanks to our chamber music series, Adam Marks and sponsorship from Yamaha Pianos, we are presenting our first zoom chamber concert Sunday, November, 8 at 4 pm. Thanks to our sponsors and donors we are able to offer this first concert up for free. I hope you will join us for this exciting new venture into our zoom hall for and afternoon of music and dialogue with Adam, Margie Hagen and hopefully you! - Festival of Trees is being re-imagined into a "Winter Wonderland" for a fun, family friendly, safe shopping experience that will be open for 5 weeks instead of 2 days! The ever-popular tree decorating competition and silent auction is on with cash prizes, your favorite artists are being invited to set up booths with their arts and crafts offerings sans artists, Mrs. Claus is firing up the oven for handmade pies, candy and cookies for purchase, decadent raffle baskets are being created and lots of varieties of trees are here for you to purchase and decorate your home for the holidays.
- The current plan for 2021 is to have exhibits up for 1-2-month periods at the Dolphin and Burnett & Jacob Foyer Galleries at the Gualala Arts center. Openings will alternate months so that every month there will be an opening day the Second Saturday of the month from 11am to 7pm. Then gallery hours will go back to 11 to 4pm. The current plan for our large group exhibits is to be held in person and also to be a version of our successful Online! Exhibits. We are starting some thing new this year and having a "Garts Members Only Preview" of the gallery exhibits on the Friday before opening to the public.
- Workshops Online! are being planned for 2021. The Memorial Mezzanine Classroom is being converted to a digital classroom for our artist instructors. Teaching and connecting with the students rather than just presenting digital demonstrations is our goal in bringing that spirit of exchange into the mix.

Dolphin Gallery in Cypress Village, Gualala. The show continues through Nov. 30.


Local residents since 1977, Mike Henderson (drawings and clay) and Jennie Henderson (textiles) will be showing a wide sampling of the art they have created in their three-studio home in Point Arena. While this will be Jennie's fourth Dolphin exhibit, it will be their

second Dolphin showing together since 2014.

In their upcoming October/November show, Jennie will feature a breadth of textile arts including hand-spun, hand-woven rugs and

throws along with ice-dyed napkin sets, dishtowels, and silk scarves. And for the first time, she will be showing large, "transparent weave" pieces.

Michael will be showing several new works from his drawing studio that combine abstraction and realism in a developing "Sticks and Stones" series, along with a few of his favorites, and a few oldies from his collection that have never been shown. There will be pottery pieces as well, both black-fired and pit-fired ceramics in several sizes.



Many area artists missed the annual Studio Discovery Tour, which invites visitors into the artists' studios and homes. Mike Henderson added "Since we truly missed our Studio Discovery Tour loyal visitors, Jennie and I hope that they will visit the Dolphin Gallery exhibit and see 'the real stuff'."

Chamber Music Series Returns With A Virtual Performance Featuring Adam Marks Sunday, November 8

An Online! Virtual Concert

Sunday, November 8, 4 pm.



Gualala Arts announces the return of the Chamber Music Series for 2020-2021. The first concert, featuring composer and pianist Adam Marks, will be a virtual concert on Sunday, November 8, 2020 at 4:00 p.m. The concert will be available to all with a link at GualalaArts.org. (Find the concert link at GualalaArts.org in early November).

Originally scheduled for an in-person piano recital on November 8, Adam Marks will be coming to chamber-music fans live from New York via Zoom. He will perform a short recital that includes a fantasy based on a Chopin Mazurka, and then engage in a question-and-answer session with the on-line audience. Marjie Van Gunten, who has offered Gualala Chamber Music Series Pre-concert talks, will introduce the session and guide the Q&A. Marks is an engaging conversationalist as well as performer. This is a wonderful opportunity to learn more about the real life of a performing artist in the middle of a pandemic. This chamber music event will last approximately 45 minutes.



As part of Albatross (his duo with vocalist Jennifer Beattie), Marks serves as the founding co-director of Artists at Albatross Reach, an arts residency/ Gualala, California. incubator in There he has helped to craft a unique collaborative process to champion the development of new multidisciplinary works and experimentation, as well as a rich environment for curious community members and local artists to explore and participate in the art-making. Marks' other programming ventures include

serving as the first non-local curator for the San Francisco Center for New Music, presenting innovative soloists and ensembles from across the country. And he's been praised by the New York Times as an "excellent pianist" with "titanic force".


